WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in the Night between the 3d and 4th Days of this present Month of April, the Dwelling-House of Mr. John Dolling, in the Parish of Bramshaw in the County of Southampton, was maliciously and wilfully set on Fire by Persons unknown, and burnt down, together with a Stable adjoining: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned therein, & hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire to the said House) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
