ON Thursday last, about Seven o'Clock in the Mornin, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess. His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, several Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, were present.

This great Event was soon after made known by the Firing of the Tower Guns.

Her Majesty is, God be praised, as well as can be expected; and the young Princess is in perfect Health.

The Fleet of Transpors, having on board the First Division of the Hessia Troops under the Command of Lieutenant General Heister, left the Weser on the 17th Instant, arrived off Dover on Wednesday last the 24th, and came Yesterday Morning to Spithead. The Troops are all in perfect Health; and are preparing for their immediate Departure for North America.
