Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that the Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Assentance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thicker, the said Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council; and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Ast for granting to His Mujesty several Duties on Coaches, and other Rates and Duties upon Indentures, Leases, Bonds, and other Deeds, and upon Cards, Dice, and Newsspapers; and for raising the Sum of Two Millions by Annuities and a Lottery to be attended with Annuities.

An Ast for enabling His Majesly to raise the Sum of One Million for the Uses and Purposes therein mentioned

An Ast for the further Encouragement of the Whale Fishery carried on from Great Britain and Ireland, and the British Deminions in Europe; and for regulating the Fees taken by the Officers of the Cuyloms in

the Island of Newfoundland.

An Act for granting further Time for allowing the Drawback upon the Exportation of Muslin and Callices imported by the East-India Company, in the Years One thousand seven hundred and seventy-four; for allowing further Time to the said Company to expose to Sale such Bohea and Singlo Teas and Cosse a remained unsold on the Fifth Day of April, One thousand seventy-fix, and also such Bohea Teas as shall be imported on or before a certain Time; and for allowing the Drawbacks on the Exportation of such Teas and Cosse; and for granting surther Time for allowing the Drawback on the Exportation of Cosse imported in the Ship Shrewsbury in the Year One thousand seven hundred and seventy-these.

An Act for allowing the Exportation of certain Quantities of Wheat and other Articles to His Mojeft's Sugar Colonies in America, and to the Island of St. Helena and to other Settlements belonging to the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East-Indies, and of Biscuit and Pease to Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Bay Chaleur, and Labrador; and for indemnifying all Persons with Respect to advising or carrying into Execution His Majesty's Orders of Council already made, for allowing the Exportation of Wheat and other Articles.

An A& for the Relief of Infolvent Debtors; and for the Relief of Bankrupts in certain Cases. An Act for allowing Corn; Grain, and Flour, imported into the Port of Preston; to be landed without Payment of the Duties, under the like Restrictions as Corn, Grain, and Flour is allowed to be landed at the several Ports mentioned in an Act made in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled; An Act to regulate the Importation and Exportation of Corn.

An Act for erecting a Lighthouse or Lighthouses and Landmarks in or near the Port of Chester; and for placing Buoss upon the Banks and Shoals leading into and in the suid Port; and for regulating of Pilots and Persens towing or tracking of Vessels to and from the City of Chester; and for fixing the Rates payable for the

An Act to declare His Majesty's natural-born Subjects inheritable to the Estates of their Ancestors, whether lineal or collateral, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; notwithstanding their Father or Mether were Aliens.

An Ast to enable the Commissioners of Sewers for several Limits in the Eastern Parts of the County of Kent; more essentially to drain and improve the Lands and

Grounds within the General Vallies.

An Act for repealing a Clause in an Act made in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to explain, amend, and reduce into One Act of Parliament, the General Laws now in being for regulating the Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, and for other Purposes, which relate to the counter-sinking of the Tire of the Wheels of all Waggons, Wains, and other Carriages to be used on Turnpike Roads; and for explaining a Prevision in the said Act with respect to the Fellies and Tire of Carriages having the Fellies of the Wheels of the Gauge of Six Inches or upwards.
