*Translation of an Act of Assembly of the States of Jersey.*

**A**T the Assembly of the States of the Island of Jersey,  
Present, The Lieutenant Governor.

Before Charles Lempriere, Esquire, Lord of Rozal, of Dielament, of Saval, &c. Judge Delegate in the Island of Jersey, assisted by John Poingdestre, Joshua Pipon, Edward Ricard, Amice Maret, Edward Le Maître, Philip De Carteret, Francis Maret, Nicholas Messervy, Charles Payn, David Patriarcke, and Elias Pipon, Esquires, Jurats; Present The King's Officers, as also the Dean and the Ministers of Grouville, St. Peter, St. Laurence, St. Saviour, St. Owen, Trinity, St. Clement St. Brelade, and St. Martin, and the Constables of St. Helier, St. Brelade, St. Peter, St. Saviour, Trinity, St. Owen, St. Laurence, St. Martin, St. John, Grouville, St. Clement, and the *Centenier* the *Coûteur* of St. Mary.

**I**N the Year 1776, the 3d Day of the Month of May, The Lieutenant-Governor having communicated to the States a Letter addressed to him by my Lord Weymouth, One of His Majesty's Secretaries of State, notifying that Her Majesty Our August Queen was safely delivered of a Princess on the 25th of last Month, and that Her Majesty and the young Princess were as well as could be expected: The States penetrated with Joy and Satisfaction by so happy an Event, have unanimously requested and authorized the Lieutenant-Governor to write to my Lord Weymouth, and to testify to him on the Part of the States the Joy which they feel on this Occasion, by the Increase of the August Family of His Majesty, our Sovereign, under whose Reign we enjoy peaceably our Liberties and Privileges; and to transmit to his Lordship the present Act.

**B**Y Letters from Captain Douglas, of His Majesty's Ship the *Isis*, dated Quebec the 8th and 15th of May, received Yesterday by Captain Hamilton, late of the *Lizard*, who arrived from thence in his Majesty's Sloop the *Hunter*, it appears that the *Isis*, which sailed from Portland on the 11th of March, having Succours on Board for the Relief of the Place, made the Island of St. Peter's on the 11th of April; that he had from thence with the greatest Difficulty made his Way, pressing the Ship by Force of Sail for Fifty or Sixty Leagues through large Fields of thick Ice; that on the 21st of April, when he got clear of the Ice, he made the Island of Anticostie, and the same Evening entered the River St. Lawrence; that on the 30th he anchored in a Snow Storm near the Pilgrim Islands, and from thence, as the Storm cleared up, observed successive Smoaks from Cape to Cape towards Quebec; and that, after various Obstacles from Fogs, Calms, or contrary Winds, he arrived on the 3d of May near Isle aux Coudres, where he was joined by His Majesty's Ship the *Surprize*, and Martin Sloop, which sailed on the 20th of March from Plymouth, having likewise Succours on Board. Captain Douglas adds, that having secured here all the French Pilots, and every Hour becoming more and more precious, he gave Orders on the 5th of May to Captain Linzee, of the *Surprize*, to make the best of his Way, and give Notice to Governor Carleton of the approaching Relief. Captain Linzee arrived in View of the Town at Six o'Clock the next Morning; and after answering the private Signals from the Garrison, came to an Anchor in the Bafon of Quebec, between the Rebel-Battery on Point Levi and the Lower Town, where the *Isis*

and Martin came to an Anchor also, very soon after; and the several Detachments they had on Board were immediately landed. Captain Douglas further observes, that the General wisely availing himself of the different Impressions which the Arrival of the Ships had made on the Minds of the Rebels, marched out to give them Battle, but that they as instantly retreated; on which Captain Douglas ordered Captain Linzee and Captain Harvey of the Martin Sloop, with a Province Armed Vessel, to proceed up the River as far as the Rapids, in Hopes to annoy them in their Retreat, which was attended with good Effect, as it hindered the Parties on the opposite Sides of the River from joining in their Flight towards Montreal. He represents their Flight to have been very precipitate, as they left not only their Cannon undischarged, their Ammunition, Scaling Ladders, Intrenching Tools, and Provisions, but even many of their Muskets.

The *Surprize* and Martin were farther successful in taking an Armed Schooner belonging to the Rebels, carrying Four 6 Pounders and Six 3 Pounders, but the Men escaped into the Woods; they also recovered His Majesty's Schooner the *Galpee*, which in the last Winter had fallen into the Hands of the Rebels, and had been sunk by them, but was soon weighed and found to be not materially damaged. It also appears, from Captain Douglas's Letters, that on the 8th of May His Majesty's Ship *Niger* arrived with Three Transports, having on Board the 47th Regiment, from Halifax; and that on the 10th, Captain Lutwidge, of His Majesty's Ship the *Triton*, arrived with the Lord Howe and Bute Transports, having Troops on Board, together with the British Queen, Agnes, and Beaver, Victuallers from England.

Captain Douglas speaks highly in Commendation of the Captains and Officers of the Ships employed to carry Succours, for their Perseverance and Exertion in the many Difficulties they had to encounter in the Passage through the Gulph, and in every other Part of the Service.

*Constantinople, May 3.* The Russian Ambassador, with his Lady, and Family, set out from hence on the 24th of last Month, on their Return to Petersburg, accompanied by a Pacha, who is to attend them to the Frontiers.

*Ritzebüttel, June 3.* This Day the Second Brigade of the Second Division of Hessian Troops in His Britannick Majesty's Service, under the Command of Major General Schmidt, was embarked at this Place; and, if the Wind continues as it is at present, they will sail Tomorrow Evening for Spithead.—General Rhetz's and Colonel Specht's Regiments sailed from hence Yesterday with a very fine Wind.

*Berlin, June 1.* His Prussian Majesty returned on Thursday from reviewing his Troops in the Neighbourhood of Magdebourg; and early this Morning he left Potsdam, in order to review those in Pomerania and Prussia.

*Brussels, June 7.* Yesterday the Prince and Princess of Orange arrived here with a great Retinue, and early this Morning they set out for Maastricht.

*St. James's, June 11.*

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Christopher D'Oyly, Esq; to be Commissary General and Chief Muster Master of all His Majesty's Forces.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Francis James Buchanan, Esq; to be Lieutenant-Governor of Kinsale and Charles Fort in the Kingdom of Ireland, in the Room of Nicholas Price, Esq; deceased.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower, the great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, at the Castle, who appeared in extraordinary Spendour to compliment His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode, set to Music, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by His Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
