WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on the 25th Day of December last past, between the Hours of Eleven and Twelve o'Clock at Night, divers Persons armed with Guns entered a Wood called Mossfimes, within the Parishes of Itringham and Saxthorpe in the County of Norfolk, being the Property, and in the Occupation, of The Right Honourable the Lord Walpole; whose Gamekeeper, being alarmed at their shooting the Pheasants, went with some Assistants to enquire who those Persons were, when one of them immediately, without speaking a Word, levelled his Gun, and wounded the said Gamekeeper in the Left Thigh: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perpetrator of so cruel and atrocious an Act, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of the Accomplishes in the same, who shall discover the Person who actually
