*Whitehall, June 24, 1776.*

**T**HE following Letter from General Carleton to Lord George Germain was this Morning received by Lieutenant Fook, of His Majesty's Ship Lizard, arrived from Quebec in the Hope Transport.

*On Board the Maria, opposite St. Ann's, May 25, 1776.*

*My Lord,*

**I** Have this Moment received an Account from Captain Forster, that he, with a Detachment of the 8th Regiment, some Canadians, and a Number of Indians, had taken the 19th Instant, a Fort at the Cedars, two Pieces of Cannon, and 390 Rebels Prisoners at Discretion. The Day following a Party of 120 Rebels crossed from the Island of Montreal to Kinchin; those were attacked by Mess. Lorimer and Mongtany, defeated and taken.

The small Force that is already arrived is drawing nearer to the Rebels, to see if any Assistance can be given to the King's good Subjects above, who have begun rather sooner than I could have wished. The Rebels are still numerous in the Province, and talk of large Reinforcements.

Lieutenant Fooks sailed from Quebec on the Afternoon of the 25th of May, and gives an Account that before his Departure some Indians had arrived from the Party at the Cedars about Eight Leagues from Montreal, who informed him that the Indians of the Western Confederacy were in Motion to join the King's Troops, and that a very large Body of them were within Three Days March of the Cedars: He adds that the same Night he left Quebec, he met the Transports with the British Regiments from Ireland, under Convoy of the Carysfort and Pearl, and had no doubt of their arriving at Quebec the next Morning; and that on his Arrival at the Isle of Coudre on the 28th he found the Transports with the Brunswick Troops, under Convoy of the Juno and Blonde, at Anchor, waiting the Return of Tide in order to proceed up to Quebec, the Wind being then unfavourable; but that Lieutenant General Burgoyne was gone before in the Surprise Frigate, and probably would land at Quebec on the Evening of the 26th.

**C**OMMODORE Hotham, who sailed in the Preston, with some others of His Majesty's Ships, to convoy the Transports, having on Board the First Division of Hessian Troops, and the Party of Guards ordered to join the Army under the Command of General Howe, gives Account in a Letter received from him dated the 5th Instant, that he was then arrived in Latitude 44: 57° North Longitude, 30: 12° West from the Lizard, with all his Convoy, except the Malaga Brig, which had parted Company in a Gale of Wind the 26th of May. He adds that the Troops continued very healthy and in good Spirits.

*Portsmouth, June 22.* On Thursday last arrived at Spithead the Transport with the Waldeck Troops on board; and they are preparing for their immediate Departure for North America.

*Dresden, June 12.* Last Sunday their Electoral Highnesses set out from Dresden with Prince An-

thon, the Elector's Brother, from the Baths of Lauenstadt; from whence the Elector and Prince Anthony will go to visit the four Camps now formed in Saxony, and review the Troops. The Court will be absent for six Weeks.

*Berlin, June 15.* His Prussian Majesty arrived in perfect Health at Sans Souci on Thursday last, from reviewing his Troops in Prussia and Pomerania.

Her Prussian Majesty, with her Court, removed to Schoenhausen the Beginning of this Month.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 22d Day of March last, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy; And whereas the Time thereby limited was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of this Instant June. And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties

ties should be continued to be paid for some longer Time: His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly Ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this Instant June, to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
