Petersburg, June 11.

THE Great Duke and Prince Henry of Prussia, accompanied by Marshal Romanzow, went Yesterday to the Palace of Peterhoff, where they propose to remain till Thursday, when they intend to return to Zarfco Zelo.

Hague, July 2. His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange and her Royal Highness the Princess are at present at Bonn, on a Visit to the Elector of Cologne; and they intend to proceed by Cologne to Dusseldorp Tomorrow, and to be at Loo by Saturday next at farthest.

St. James's, July 6.

The King has been pleased to confer the Honour of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath on Guy Carleton, Esq; Captain General and Governor in Chief of His Majesty's Province of Quebec, General and Commander in Chief of all His Majesty's Forces in the said Province, and on the Frontiers of the Provinces bordering thereupon.

The King has been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Baronet of the Kingdom of Great Britain unto John Hamilton, of Marlborough House Portsmouth in the County of Southampton, Esq; Captain of His Majesty's Ship Hector; and he had Yesterday the Honour to kiss His Majesty's Hand on the Occasion.

Whitehall, June 6.

GENERAL Howe, in his Dispatches to Lord George Germaine, dated Halifax, June the 7th and 8th, which were Yesterday delivered by Captain Dudingston of the Navy, gives an Account that the Troops under his Command were embarked, and waited only for favourable Weather to proceed to Sea.

He also mentions that an Ordnance Storeship, named the Hope, had been taken in Boston Bay.

The General had just received Advice that some of the Transports with the Highlanders were arrived at the Entrance of the Harbour, and was not without Hopes that they should all join under Sail the next Day.
