Petersburgh, June 18. THE Empress, with the Great Duke, Prince Henry of Prussia, and many of the Principal Nobility, came to Town To-day from Zarsco Zelo; to which Place her Imperial Majesty will return in the Evening.

Stockholm, June 28. The Ceremony of the Installation of the Parliament of Wasa was performed this Forenoon. The King, seated on his Throne, with the Ornaments of Royalty, made two Speeches; and was answered by the new President Baron Kurck; who, with two Councillors, and five Assesors, took the usual Oaths, and received at the King's Hands the Diploma, Seals, and other Ensigns of their Offices. All the Royal Family were present on this Occasion; as also the Foreign Ministers.

Hague, July 9. His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, and her Royal Highness the Princess, returned to Loo on Sunday last in perfect Health, well pleased with their Tour, and the great Marks of Respect, and Distinction, which they every where received.
