**T**HE Great Duke, attended by Marshal Romanzow, Count Soltikow, Prince Kourakin, and several other Gentlemen, set out from Zarfco-Zelo Yesterday Evening for Berlin, and will wait at Riga to do the Honours of that Place to his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia, who leaves Zarfco-Zelo this Afternoon, and will make a shorter Stay at Riga than the Great Duke, in order to receive his Imperial Highness at Konigsberg, from whence they will continue their Journey together.

*Florence, July 2.* On the 24th of last Month, being the Festival of St. John, the Tutelar Saint of Florence, the Great Duke received the Homage of all the Subaltern Towns and Feudatories of Tuscany, and performed all the Publick Ceremonies as usual on that Occasion. On the 30th their Royal Highnesses set out on their Journey to Vienna; they are to meet the Arch-dutchess Christina at Padua, and to go from thence to Venice, where they propose to stay three Days, and then to proceed to Vienna.

*Turin, July 6.* Their Sardinian Majesties went on Monday last to Montcalier, at which Place they will probably reside till December.

*Brussels, July 16.* Her Imperial Majesty has conferred the Post of Commander in Chief of the Troops in the Low Countries, vacant by the Death of General Bulow, upon Monsieur Le Comte de Voguera, General of Cavalry.
