BY Admiralty-Office, July 23, 1776. A Letter received from Vice Admiral Lord Howe, dated the 23d of June last, it appears that his Lordship arrived on that Day off the Port of Halifax in the Eagle; and having learnt that the Fleet and Army under the Conduct of Vice Admiral Lord Shulldham had left that Port on the 10th of June, his Lordship intended to proceed immediately to join him.

Vienna, July 10. The Grand Duke and Dutchess of Tuscany are expected here on Sunday next.

Berlin, July 13. The Queen of Prussia is now entirely recovered from her late Indisposition, and proposes removing from Shoenhausen to this Place on Wednesday next.

The Prince and Princess of Wirtemberg, with their Daughters, came to the new Palace at Sans Souci Yesterday; they were met there by the Princess Amelia, and the Prince and Princess Ferdinand of Prussia.

His Imperial Highness the Great Duke of Russia, and his Royal Highness Prince Henry, are expected here by the 21st of this Month.
