Admirally-Office, July 30. P Letters received from Captain Douglas, of His Majefty's Ship Ifis, dated at Quebec the 26th and 27th of laft Month, it ap-pears, That immediately after railing the Seige of Quebec, of which he gave an Account in big Letters of the Seth and where his Letters of the 8th and 15th of May, every proper Measure was taken to facilitate the farther Operations against the Rebels, by fending down the River all the Pilots which could be procured to bring up the Transports that were daily expected with General Burgoyne from England and Ireland; and, that no Time might be loft on their Arrival, and, that no Time might be loft on their Arrival, he had provided Pilots for the upper River, and placed Frigates and Armed Veffels in proper Sta-tions to affift and efcort them; and alfo, left the Transforts should be prevented by contrary Winds from failing up the River, he had stationed Veffels with Provisions at proper Places for the Ufe of the Troops, if they should be obliged to difembark and march by Land. By these Dispositions, all the Transports with Troops, which had Pilots on Board. Transports with Troops, which had Pilots on Board, proceeded up the River without stopping at Quebec, and arrived at Three Rivers Time enough to defeat the Rebels, and afterwards drive them from St. John's, and all their Pofts below Lake Champlain. Captain Douglas in the fame Letter fays, that the prudent and spirited Behaviour of Captain Harvey, of the Martin Sloop, cannot be too much commended; and that the Zeal, Vigour, and Unanimity, of His Majefty's Servants on both Elements was fcarcely equalled on any other Occasion within his Remembrance. He also writes that he was, in Concert with General Carleton, confidering upon a proper. Eftablishment for Armed Vessels to be employed on the Lakes Champlain and Ontario, and in contriving the most expeditious Means of getting them, with other Craft on the faid Lakes, in order to the better accelerating the Paffage of the Army; and that Cap-tain Harvey, of the Martin, was returning to Sorel, in order to examine into the Means of floating between Camels (as is practifed in Russia and Holland) through the Rapids of Chamble into Lake Champlain, the Six Armed Veffels, one of which was already arrived from England, and the others hourly expected.

Admiralty-Office, July 30. APTAIN Le Cras, Senior Captain of His Majefty's Ships at Plymouth, in his Letter, dated the 26th Inftant, has the following Para-graph, viz. " The Mercury Brig, a Prize to the " Cerberus and Merlin, arrived the Night before; " and the Perfon who had the Command of the faid Brig fays they parted from the Cerberus the the 26th of June, Block Island on the Coast of America, bearing N. NE. Distance 17 Leagues; " and that they then faw Vice Admiral Lord Shuld-" ham with his Squadron, and the Transports under " his Convoy, steering W. by S. for New York; " and that on the Evening before they had feen the " Greyhound Frigate, with General Howe on " Board."

Admiralty-Office, July 30. BY a Letter received from Vice-Admiral Young, dated at Antigua the 31ft of May laft, it ap-pears, that Captain Bryne, of His Majefty's Ship the Hind, which had been fent on Service to St. Augustine in the Province of Georgia, having In-telligence that the Rebels were fitting Armed Vef-fels in the adjacent Rivers; and being at Anchor off Sunbury River, he ordered Lieutenant Ellis, of the Hinchingbrooke Armed Schooner, with the Ship's Tender and Boats, mann'd and arm'd, to

proceed over the Bar, where they fet on Fire a Brig that was loading, and a Ship on the Stocks, in-tended by the Rebels for a Privateer to carry 20 Guns. It further appears from the Admiral's aforementioned Letter, that fince the Account tranfmitted in his Letter of the 3d of March, and pub-listed in the Gazette of the 8th of last Month, the Cruizers under his Command had feized Seventeen more Ships and Veffels, either belonging to or employed in carrying on a Trade with His Majefty's Rebellious Subjects in North America.

Vienna, July 17. On Saturday last the Grand Duke and Dutchess of Tuscany, together with the Prince and Princess of Saxe Teschen, arrived in perfect Health at the Palace of Schonbrunn; where the Nobility and Foreign Ministers had Yesterday the Honor of paying their Respects to their Royal Highnesses.

The Bifhop of Bafil will receive the Investiture. of his Temporal Principality from the Emperor on Saturday next, having fent a Minister to this Court for that Purpose.

Berlin, July 20. The Queen of Pruffia removed from Shoenhaufen here on Wednefday laft. On Thurfday the Prince and Prince's of Wirtemberg, with their two Daughters, arrived from Potz dam; and it is expected his Pruffian Majefty will be here fome Time this Evening.
