Petersburg, July 9.
THE Empress removed from Zarfco Zelo to Peterhoff on Saturday last; and on Sunday there was a brilliant Court at the last mentioned Place.

This being the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Accession to the Throne, and To-morrow the Great Duke's Name-Day, there will be a Court at Peterhoff on both those Days.

Carolsruhe in the Margraviate of Dourlach, July 14. Last Night her Serene Highness the Princess Amelia Frederica, Consort of the Hereditary Prince of Baden, was happily delivered of two Princesses, who were christened by the Names of Catherina Amelia Christiana Luifac, and Frederica Wilhelmina Carolina.

Berlin, July 23. On the 21st Instant his Imperial Highness the Great Duke of Russia arrived here, accompanied by his Royal Highness Prince Henry. His Imperial Highness was received by his Prussian Majesty, and all the Royal Family, with the greatest Splendour and Magnificence.

Hague, July 30. The Russian Minister Prince Gallitzin is set out for Loo, to present to her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange the Ensigns of the Order of St. Catherine on the Part of the Empress of Russia. Her Imperial Majesty has conferred on Prince Gallitzin the Order of St. Alexander Newski.

St. James's, August 3.

The King has been pleased to grant unto William Lane, Esq; Sub-Brigadier and Cornet in His Majesty's First Troop of Horse Guards, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue may take the Surname of Lutwyche, and bear the Arms of Lutwyche; (the same being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office;) and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
