**T**HE Empress was pleased to present Monf. Moufin Pouschkin with the Key of Chamberlain on Tuesday last.

Her Imperial Majesty intends to review the Fleet in Cronstadt Road on Thursday next, and will do Admiral Greig the Honour of dining on board his Ship.

Stockholm, July 19. A few Days ago his Royal Highness the Duke of Sudermania returned hither; and, after paying his Duty to the Queen Dowager at Swartsio, his Royal Highness went to Eckolund to make his Report to the King his Brother of the State of the Troops in Scania and in it's Neighbourhood.

Berlin, July 27. On Tuesday the 23d Instant his Royal Highness Prince Henry, in the Name of the Empress of Russia, made the Demand of the Princess of Wirtemberg in Marriage for the Great Duke; and on Wednesday Morning there was a Court of Felicitation on this Occasion at the Great Duke's Apartments, and in the Evening at the Princess of Wirtemberg's.
