Peter Burgh, July 19.

ESTERDAY Morning at Eleven o'Clock the Empress, attended by many of the Great Officers of State and Household, went in a magnificent Barge from Oranienbaum to Admiral Greig's Ship. Her Imperial Majelty was welcomed by Cheers from each of the Men of War as the paffed them, the Yards, &c. being manned at her Approach. As foon as the Empreis went on Board the Admiral's Ship, the Imperial Standard was hoifted; upon which the whole Fleet faluted by a general Difcharge of their Cannon, as did likewife the Fortifications of Cronftadt, which mount nine hundred Guns. The Admiral's Ship mount nine hundred Guns. The Admiral's Ship returned the Salute of the Fleet; which Honour was acknowledged by each Ship's firing Half their Number of Guns. After the Empress had dined at a Table of one Hundred Covers with the principal Officers of the Marine and other Departments, and many Perfons of the First Distinction, a Signal was made for the whole Fleet to weigh Anchor : and her Imperial Majesty, attended by the Prince and Count Alexis Orlow, Field Marshal Galitzin, and Count Bruce the Adjutant on Duty, rowed along the Line of the Fleet in her Barge, being again faluted by a general Difcharge from the Men of War and Batteries; after which her Imperial Majefly went on Board one of the Yachts, failed for a fhort Time with the Fleet, and return-ed between Six and Seven o'Clock to Oranienbaum.

Admiral Greig was presented with the Order of St. Alexander Newlky.

Petersburg, July 16. Count Skavronsky, many Years Grand Master of her Imperial Majesty's Count Skavronsky, many Household, died last Week at his Estate in this Neighbourhood, and was Yesterday interred in the Chapel of the Convent of St. Alexander Newsky.

Constantinople, July 3. Advice has been received here, that on the 16th of April last the City of Bassor had surrendered to the Persians by Capitulation, after a Siege of more than twelve Months, the Inhabitants being reduced to the last Extremity by Sickness and Famine.

Berlin, August 3. His Imperial Highness the Grand Duke of Russia was received at Potzdam His Imperial Highness the with the fame Pomp and Solemnity as at Berlin. On Monday he fets out for Rhinfberg, the Country Refidence of his Royal Highnefs Prince Henry of Pruffia, where he propoles remaining three Days,

Prufia, where he propoles remaining time Days, and then continuing his Journey to Peterfbourg. Hamburgh, August 6. Laft Friday Evening the Dutchels of Mecklenbourg-Schwerin arrived in per-fect Health at her Hotel in this City, and the Day before yesterday in the Afternoon all the Foreign Ministers and Nobility here waited upon her Serene Highness.

Paris, August 7. On Sunday Night her Royal Highness the Counters d'Artois was safely delivered of a Daughter.—Her Royal Highness and the young Princels are both as well as can be expected.

The Prince of Conti died on Saturday Afternoon,

and is to be buried this Day at L'isle-Adam. Hague, August 8. We hear from Loo, that the Anniverfary of Her Royal Highnels the Princels of Orange's Birth day, was celebrated there yesterday; and that her Royal Highness wore the Order of St. Catherine.
