O *Schwetzing, July 19.* On the 16th Instant, about Seven o'Clock in the Morning, died, in the 81st Year of her Age, her Serene Highness Frances Christina, Countess Palatine of the Rhine, Princess of the Roman Empire, and Abbess of Essen and Thorne, Aunt to his Serene Highness the Elector Palatine.

Vienna, August 2. The Emperor is gone to the Camp near Laxembourg, where several Military Manoeuvres will be performed on Monday and Wednesday next, in Presence of her Imperial Majesty and the whole Court.

Dresden, August 7. On Saturday last their Electoral Highnesses returned to this City from the Baths of Lauestadt; and the next Day they received the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and all the Military in Garrison here: The Day was observed as a Grand Gala, and there was a brilliant Drawing-room in the Evening.

Hague, August 11. We learn from Kirckheim-Pohland, that her Serene Highness the Princess of Nassau-Weilbourg was delivered of a Princess on the 6th Instant at Two o'Clock in the Morning.

St. James's, August 17.
