Dublin Caftle: August 12, EING the Anniversary of the Birth of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Flag was difplayed on Bedford Tower ; His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrifon, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks : And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations; and other Rejoicings throughout the City.

Berlin, August 10. On Sunday Evening, the 4th Inftant, there was a Concert and Supper at her Prussian Majeity's Apartments, and a very numerous and fplendid Ailenbly of the Nobility to take Leave of the Great Duke of Russia, who left this Place early on Monday Morning, attended, as on his Entry, by the different Trading Companies, the State-Coaches, Body Guards, &c. the Cannon con-flantly firing till his Imperial Highnefs reached his Travelling Equipage a little beyond the Gates of the City. His Imperial Highness dined that Day at Oranienbourg, and arrived in the Evening at Rhinfberg, the Refidence of Prince Henry, where he proposed staying till Friday, his Royal Highness having made all necessary Preparations for his Imperial Highnefs's Reception and Entertainment. General Lentulus and Count Werthern attend his Im-perial Highness to Memel, to which Place the Princess of Wirtemberg likewise accompanies her Daughter, who is to be met there by the Persons appointed to compose her Court; the Countess Romanzow, the Marshal's Lady, is appointed Grande Maitresse. Her Serene Highness will set out four Days after the Great Duke, and will not reach Petersburg till Ten Days after his Arrival in that Capital.

His Pruffian Majefty returned to Potzdam immediately after the Great Duke's Departure ; and the Queen removed the fame Day to Shoenhaufen.
