August, 1776, PRESENT,

P R E S E N T, The King's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

7 HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty lecond Day of March last, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majetty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas the Time thereby limited was by Orders in Council prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirty first Day of this Instant August; and it being judged expedient for His Ma jefty's Service, that the faid Bounties should be continued to be paid for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered. That the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant August to the Thirty first Day of October next inclusive. — Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
