A PROCLAMATION.
GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Charles Lord Cathcart was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of Great Britain, and is since deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House in Edinburgh, on Thursday the 14th of November next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and chuse another Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the said Charles Lord Cathcart, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent, (such Proxies being Peers) and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their Votes; and, immediately after such Election made and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer so elected, and sign and attest the same in the Presence of the said Peers, the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We strictly charge and command, That this Proclamation be duly published at the Market-cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County-Towns in Scotland. Twenty-five Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such Election.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the Twenty-fifth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, in the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign.

The Empress Queen intends to accompany them to Neustadt, a Town at two Posts Distance from hence, where her Imperial Majesty has founded a Military Academy, and likewise in it's Neighbourhood a large Village for the Improvement of Agriculture. Her Imperial Majesty and their Royal Highnesses will remain at Neustadt till Sunday the 22d Instant.
