Peterburg, September 10.
THE Great Duke, accompanied by General Soltikow, and General Ungern the Governor of Peterburg, set out on Sunday Morning last for Yambourg, to meet the Princess, his future Great Dutchess.

Berlin, September 21. This Morning His Prussian Majesty began his annual Review (which is to be continued Tomorrow and next Day) of the Troops garrisoned at Potzdam and it's Neighbourhood. Several General Officers, stationed in other Parts of these Dominions, have received Orders to be present at Potzdam on this Occasion.

Monf. de Bulow, Lieutenant-General in his Prussian Majesty's Service, and Knight of the Black Eagle, died here on Thursday Morning last, after an Illness of a very few Days.

Hamburg, September 24. We have Advices from Lubek, that his Serene Highness Prince Peter Frederick Lewis of Holstein Gottorp was, on the 16th Instant, unanimously elected Coadjutor of that Bishoprick, in the room of Prince Peter, Son of the present Bishop.

Hague, September 26. His Serene Highness the Prince Stadtholder and her Royal Highness the Princess, with the Princes and Princess their Children, arrived here Yesterday in the Evening in perfect Health from Loo in Guelderland. The Field-Marshal Duke of Brunswick-Wolfenbuttle is also returned to this Place from his Government.
