Her Majesty dined in publick upon the Throne, with the Great Duke and Dutchess, being served by the Great Officers of the Household. The four first Classes of the Nobility dined at diffefent Tables in the same Hall. In the Evening there was a Ball at Court, and Illuminations throughout the City.

This Morning the Ladies and Great Officers of the Court, the four first Classes of the Nobilty, the Foreign Ministers, the Officers of the Guards, and other Regiments here, and of the Navy, had the Honour of being presented to the Great Dutchess, at her Imperial Highness's Apartments, and of kissing her Hand.
