PROCLAMATION, A For a General Fast.

ĞĖÖRGE R.

WE taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and necessary Measures of Force, which We are obliged to use against Our rebellious Subjects in Our Colonies and Provinces in North America, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that he will vouchfafe a special Blessing on Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be obferved throughout that Part of Our King-dom of Great Britain called Scotland, upon Thurfday the Twelfth Day of December next, that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and for imploring His Intervention and Bleffing speedily to deliver Our Loyal Subjects within Our Colonies and Provinces in North America, from the Violence, Injuffice, and Tyranny of those daring Rebels, who have assumed to themselves the Exercise of Arbitrary Power; to open the Eyes of those who have been deluded by specious Falsehoods into Acts of Treason and Rebellion ; to turn the Hearts of the Authors of these Calamities; and finally to reftore Our People, in those distracted Provinces and Colonies, to the happy Condition of being Free Subjects of a Free State, under which heretofore they flourished to long, and prospered fo much. --- And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Fait be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as we may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo Religious a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, ye pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Igno-tance. And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame pub-lifted : And We appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day abovementioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service. Given at Our Court at St. James's the Thirtieth Day of October, One thousand feven hundred and feventy-fix, in the Seventeenth Year of Our Reign.

GOD Save the KING.

Peterfburg, October 8. Yesterday Morning at Ten o'Clock the four first Classes of the Nobility, and the Foreign Ministers, assembled at the Palace, on a Signal of five Guns being fired from the Fortrefs; and foon after Eleven the Emprefs, with the Great Duke and Dutchefs, proceeded to the Chapel, where the Marriage Ceremony was performed by her Imperial Majefty's Confeffor. Prince Orlow held the Crown over the Head of the Great Duke, and Moni. Betskoy over the Head of the Great Dutchefs. After the Ceremony a Sermon was preached by Plato, Archbishop of Moscow. On Account of the Length and Fatigue of the preceding Ceremony, the Empress did not receive the Compliments of Congratulation of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers, as had been in-tended. Her Imperial Majesty afterwards dined in Publick upon the Throne, with the Great Duke and Dutchefs. Tables were fpread in the fame Saloon for the four first Classes of the Nobility. In the Evening there was a Ball at Court ; and the Festivities of the Day were concluded by very magnificent IIluminations.

This Morning the Nobility and Foreign Mi-nifters had the Honour of complimenting their Imperial Highnesses in their Apartments; and this Evening there will be a Ball at Court, and Supper for the four first Classes and the Foreign Minifters.
