French King，for the nor permiting any perfons to live within the French Conquelfs，whofe Relations ane in the Spaniat Service，and accordingly feveral Families are cr．me hither trom thence，all their Elhates being coniff cated，not having hadtime either to tranfport or fell their moveables．Summons are alfo fene by the faid Marefchal to the chief Nobilicy here，whofe Eftutes lie within the French Conquefts，to repair to their Habita－ tions within a limi ed time，and to take an Oath of Al－ legiance to that King，or elfe their Eltates to be confifia－ red，and annexed to the Crown．The young Prince of Ifenpliten is lately married to the daughrer of Maref－ chal $d^{\prime} H$ umieres，which hath to much offended his Ex cellency，that he hath forbid the Prince his Father （although it＇s faid the faid matriage was made withour Hivknowledg＇）to come to this Court，and liath fufpen－ ded him from the Government of Guelderland，and appointed the Marquis de Conflays to fupply that Go－ verniment till farther ordersfrom Spain，and hath de－ clared the young Prince of $1 \int f e n g b i c n$ a Deferter and Rebel On Thurfday his Excellency intends for Ant－ werp，and from thence to take a thort curn into Flun－ ders，to fee the condition of thofeparts．

Ditto，Febr．16．This morning，we aretold，ad－ vice came from feveral parts，that all the French Troops that were quartered between chis City and Mons，as at fo thofe that were at Nivelle and charleroy，are march－ ing cowards Huynault．That the laft night the Marefchal d＇Humieres accompanied with a great many of the No－ bilitt，came from Aeth to Enghien，and that the French Troops making togethet 20000 ，were encamped near Enghiet，and that they have all forts of Provifions ve－ ry cheap in their Camp．The Letters add，that accor－ cing to all appearance the Enemy intends to befiege Mons or $S t$ Gbiflain＇；many pieces of Cannon for Bat－ tery and Mortar pieces having been brought from Cbar－ Leroy to Binch，and others by water from Tourn³ to Conde；to the humber of 60 ，with all materials necef． fary for 2 Siege．We are cold that there is alfo advice from $f_{t}$ Omers，that they there likewife believe they Thall be fuddenly befieged， 25 large Veffels，laden with Cannon，Anmmunition，and all other nateriats for a Siege being gone from Lille to Aire，and the French ha－ ving not only feized all the Pofts round st omers，but likewife laid up vaf？quantities of Corm and Forage ift all the adjacent places．That on the other fide the Prince of Rocbucks，Governor of St Omers，is nor wanting rodo his part to put all things into a pofture of defence， having by opening a Sluice fet moft of the Countrey round under Water，Atopped up all the Gates but one， and broten till the Bridges．Our Governor the Duke de Villa Hermofa has fent and Exprefs to the Hague，to give the Prince of Orange an account of the polture of things，who we doubt not but will make all poffible halle to come to our affiftance．On Thurduay next his Excellency intends to part hence for Antwoerp，and from thence to make a turn into Flanders，to vifit the feve－ ral places in that Province．Our laft Spanifh Letters have given this Court greas fatisfaction，not doubting but we thall fuddenly fee the good effects of the late changes ar Madrid．

Pares，Febr．17．The Marefichal de Gedmmont is parted in great halte for Bayome，to fte the Fortifications of that City fepaired，they baving fuffered very much by the late great Flods in thore＂parts．We cannot yet learn that the King has fixed the day of his departure towards the Army，though all the difcourleat Court is，that it will be about the begioning of the next month．It is confide nily faid that four Regiments of Horfe，and two Bateallions of Font；will embark ahouk the mid－ die of the next mourh ac Thootion，in order to their paffing to Mr fisina，from whence we have not of late received any thing
of moment．The States of the Proyince of Fanguadoc have not oniy ralled a Regiment of Dragoons，confifting in 17 Coma－ pances，at their own charge，hut will like wile maintain it du ring fuch time as the King flall think fic to keep 16 on fuor，at Iealt during the prefent War；the command of the fuid Regi－ ment is given to the Chevalyer de Oznpes．From Mandid we have a particular account of the arrival there cf ⿻上丨 $\boldsymbol{f}$ unn of Suft ia，and that orders were iffu•d for the apprehending frve－ ral great Officers，and requiring others forthwht toleave Ma－ drid．That the Nobility continue to profecute the Matquis de Villa，Sict ra with much heat，againft wbom，it＇s \｛aid，\＆Proce fs is framing，but as yet we do not hear the particulars of what they mean tocharge him with．Thequeen continued ftllat $M n^{n}$－ drid，and had not yet feen $\mathcal{D}$ nn fuan fince his arrival；it is be－ lieved her Majefty will retire to Telede，Granada，or fome other place．The Let：ers from Nimegren tell $\boldsymbol{u} \subset$ ，that there was fine iffer＇nce lerweet nur Anibagadors and the Ambafador of Dinmarh，concernme the langurge to be ofed in the Powers to be given by the two Crowns to their Ambafladurs there
