AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 20th Day of December, 1776,

P R E S E N T,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of October last, to promise and declare,

That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders, as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eighth Day of November last, to promise and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might secrete themselves, that so such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant December: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounty and Rewards is near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant December, to the Twenty-eighth Day of February next inclusive.—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Stockholm, November 29. His Swedish Majesty a few Days ago held a Chapter of his Orders, when his Serene Highness Prince Frederick of Hesse Cassel, and Field-Marshal Count Spens, were created Knights of the Order of Serafins. At the same Time Lieutenant-General Count Lewenhaupt was decorated with the Great Ribbon of the Order of the Sword; Major-General Baron Siegroth was appointed Commander of the same Order; and Baron Sparre, Chancellor of the Court, Commander of the Order of the Polar Star.

Lisbon, December 7. The Queen of Portugal, by a Royal Decree published the 4th Instant, is appointed to govern during his most Faithful Majesty's Illness.

The King has been pleased to grant unto William Cooper, Doctor in Divinity, the Place and Dignity of a Canon and Prebendary of Northwell otherwise Norwell Overhall in the Collegiate Church of St. Mary of Southwell in the County of Nottingham and Diocese of York, the same being now void by the Death of Dr. Robert Gilbert, the last Prebendary thereof, and in His Majesty's Gift for this Turn by Virtue of His Prerogative Royal.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Andrew Cheap, Clerk, Master of Arts, the Place and Dignity of a Canon and Prebendary of Knaresborough in the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of St. Peter in York, void by the Death of Dr. Robert Gilbert, late Prebendary thereof, and in His Majesty's Gift for this Turn by Virtue of His Prerogative Royal.

St. James's, December 21.

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elise to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of York, to elect an Archbishop thereof, the See being void by the Death of Dr. Robert Drummond, late Archbishop thereof; and also a Letter recommending to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Dr. William Markham, now Bishop of Chester, to be by them elected into the said Archbishoprick of York.

Dublin Castle, December 14.

Yesterday being the Day appointed by His Majesty for a General Fast and Humiliation, his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in State to Christ-Church, attended by several of the Nobility and Gentry, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Commons of the City of Dublin, and escorted by a Squadron of Dragoons; where a most excellent Sermon, suitable to the Occasion, was preached by the Reverend Edward Baily, D. D. Dean of Ardfert, and Archdeacon of Dublin, one of his Excellency's Chaplains: The Sword of State was carried to and from Church by the Earl of Belvedere. There were numerous Congregations in all the Churches, and other Places of Worship, throughout this City; and the Day was observed in the most devout and solemn Manner.
