T St. James's, January 18.
HIS Day being kept as the Anniversary of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park, and at the Tower, were fired at One o'Clock. There will be a Ball at Court this Evening, and Illuminations and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy in London and Westminster.

St. James's, January 18.
The King has been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Baronet of the Kingdom of Great Britain unto Charles Douglas, Esq; Captain in His Majesty's Royal Navy, and to his Issue Male.

Lisbon, December 31. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Brasil was delivered of a Princess on Sunday the 22d Instant. The Infanta was baptized immediately.

Lisbon, January 1. His Most Faithful Majesty is so much recovered from his late dangerous Illness, that Orders were given Yesterday for discontinuing the Publick Prayers which were offered up for his Majesty, and a Te Deum was sung in the King's Chapel in the Evening.

James Morgan and Sons, was attempted to be burnt, the said Warehouse having been broken open, and a Box therein, containing several Combustible Materials, set on Fire: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said atrocious Offences, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of the Offenders, (except the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the said Ships or Warehouse) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement for bringing to Punishment the Person or Persons who committed the atrocious Crime of setting the said Ships on Fire, the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Bristol do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS, to be paid without any Deduction whatsoever by the Chamberlain of the said City to any Person or Persons who shall discover the Offender or Offenders, so that he, she, or they, be apprehended and convicted thereof.
