York Satterday Night 25. 1777.

My Lord

You may take this for A Warning, that if you do Not send the prefs Gang out of York before Next Teuesday you may Expect your own houfe set on fire and the Manchon houfe too — there is 273 Yong Men set there hands to A paper to put the A Bove into Execution.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in writing or

sending the said Threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement for bringing to Punishment the Person or Persons who wrote or sent the said Letter, the Mayor and Commonalty of the City of York do hereby offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS, to be paid by the Chamberlains of the said City to any Person or Persons (except as before excepted) who shall discover the Offender, on his or her Conviction for the said Offence.
