W Hereas, about Five o'Clock in the Afternoon of Saturday the 7th of December last, a dreadful Fire broke out in the Rope-house of His Majesty's Yard at Portsmouth, which raged with Such Violence, that before the same could be extinguished the greatest Part of the faid Rope-houfe awas burnt down, and the Stores and Materials therein were totally consumed and cestroyed: And whereas there is great Reason to suspect that the said Rope-house, Stores, and Materials, were wilfully and maliciously set on Five by some evil-dispo-sed Persons at present unknown: In order therefore to discover and bring to Justice the Persons guilty of the above mentioned Offence, My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are pleased to promise a Reward of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, assover any of the Offenders guilty of the said Offence, so as such Offenders, or any one or more of them, shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof; the said Reward to be paid, clear of all Deductions whatseever, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, immediately after the Conviction of such Offender or Offenders.

And, as a farther Encouragement, any of the said Ossinders (except the Person who actually set the Premission Fire) who shall discover any one or more of his or their Accomplices in the said Ossence, so as he or they shall be apprehended and prosecuted to Conviction, will be intitled to His Majesty's most gracious Pardon. And if he is prest and your worship suffers him to be carried of, you My depend on it there will somthing happen to you or your House within one Week after—that will be very disagreeable—Therefore beg you'l Exert your Self—from your well wishing Friend T P
