

made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, so far as the same relate to the Road from the Turnpike Road between the Town and County of Poole, and Winbourn Minster, in the County of Dorset, to the Turnpike Road in the Parish of Brianston, in the said County of Dorset, which leads from Blandford Forum to Dorchester.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road from the Town of Skipton, to the Turnpike Road leading from Leeds to Ripon, near Ockbeck, in the Township of Bilton with Harrogate, and from thence to communicate with the Road leading from Knarborough to Wetherby, in the West Riding of the County of York.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of Three several Acts of Parliament, for repairing the Roads therein mentioned, in the County of Bucks, so far as the said Acts relate to the Road from the West End of the Town of Wendover, to the End of a Lane called Oak Lane, next the Great Road called the Oxford Road, and also Half a Mile of Road next from the River Colne towards Beconsfield in the said County.

An Act for repealing so much of Three Acts made in the 11th, 17th, and 33d Years of the Reign of King George the Second, for repairing several Roads leading to and from the Town of Derby in the County of Derby, as relates to the Road leading from the North Side of Cavendish Bridge in the said County of Derby, through the said Town of Derby to Brassington in the said County; and for making more effectual Provision for the Repair of the said Road.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, for repairing and widening the Road from the Halfway House, in the Parish of Lower Compton in the County of Dorset, through the Towns of Yeovil, Crewkerne, and Chard, to the East End of the Town of Axminster in the County of Devon, and several other Roads round the Town of Yeovil in the County of Somerset; and for amending two Roads leading from Vagg Hollow in the Parish of Yeovil, and the Road from Chard to Cheserway Ash, and from White Down to Perry Street in Chard, and from thence to the Turnpike Road near Tytherleigh Inn in the said County of Dorset.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, for diverting, altering, widening, repairing, and amending, the Roads from the Town of Halifax, and from Sowerby Bridge in the County of York, by Todmorden, to Burnley and Littleborough in the County of Lancaster.

East India-House, March 26, 1777.

AT a General Court of Directors of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East-Indies, held this Day at their House in Leadenball-street, The Court of Directors laid before this Court the following Resolution passed by them this Day:

“ Resolved unanimously, That the Gentlemen in the Direction, finding themselves very injuriously treated in two Pamphlets lately published, one intitled, Letter from Mahommed Ali Chan, Nabob of Arcot, to the Court of Directors, to which is annexed a State of Facts relative to Tanjore, with an Appendix of original Papers; the other intitled, Original Papers relative to Tanjore; both printed for T. Cadell in the Strand, 1777: They therefore very earnestly entreat this Court, and all the Proprietors, to suspend their Judgment on the Conduct of their Directors, thus indecently attacked by an anonymous and insidious Publication, until they shall have fully and satisfactorily justified themselves to their Constituents and to the Public, for which they have already made considerable Preparations; and are bold to assure this Court, from the Materials before them, that they have not the least Doubt of refuting those heavy Charges, which, could they be proved, would not only render them unfit to conduct the Affairs of this Company, but utterly unworthy of every Degree of Public Trust or Confidence.

“ The Court of Directors feel the Impropriety of noticing, and thereby giving Consequence to Publications of this Nature; but as they conceive
