by Colonel Bird, embarked in Four Transports; and proceeding up the North River the 22d Inftant, under the Conduct of Capt. Ferguion in the Brune, with the Dependance and another Galley fitted for the Occafion; the Enemy, upon the sudden Discovery and Approach of the Armament next Day, fet Fire to a Part of their Magazines and Barracks be-fore they retreated. The Troops after they landed did the fame to the reft; whereby this plentiful Depolit of Provisions, Stores, and other Necessaries of various Kinds, was totally deftroyed, with no other Lofs than Two Seamen, who were miffing when the Troops re-embarked the fucceeding Day.

The Lift of Veffels feized as Prizes, and of Recaptures made, by the American Squadron, between the 10th of March and 31st of December, 1776, according to the Returns received by the Vice Admiral the Viscount Howe, will be inferted in the next Gazette.

Spithead, May 9. This Morning His Majesty's Ship the Proteus, with the Royal Britain, Refolution, and Christian Transports, having on Board the Hanau Chaffeurs, and the St. Andrew Ordnance Store ship, failed from hence for Quebec.
