G O D save the K I N G.

Peterburg, June 24. On Sunday Afternoon the Count of Gothland received the Visits of the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction; and, after walking in the publick Gardens of the Summer Palace, supped at Mr. Betskoy's. Yesterday and this Morning the Count visited the Academies of Arts and Sciences, and is now set out for Peterhoff, where he will stay till Saturday next, and then return to Town to dine with Prince Potemkin at the Newky Islands, and to be present at a Review of Light Troops.

Count Panin Yesterday took Leave of her Imperial Majesty, and will set out Tomorrow for his Estates near Moscow, from whence he intends to return the latter End of August.

Hague, July 15. The Prince and Princess of Nassau Weilbourg were to leave Loo last Night, and to proceed for Germany.

St. James's, July 18.

This Day M. Dreyer, Minister Resident from the King of Denmark, had his first Private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Credentials.

To which he was introduced by the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Weymouth, (in the Absence of the Right Honourable the Earl of Suffolk, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Northern Department) and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
