WARWICKSHIRE MILITIA.

September 3, 1777.

THE Deputy-Lieutenants of the County of Warwick, at a General Meeting held this Day, have ordered that the Militia of the said County shall assemble and meet at Stratford upon Avon in the said County, on Saturday the 20th of September instant, to be trained and exercised for Twenty-eight Days together, at the said Place, or at such other Place or Places in the said County as shall be hereafter appointed by the Lord Lieutenant of the said County and the said Deputy-Lieutenants, or in the Absence of the Lord Lieutenant by the said Deputy-Lieutenants. And all the Militia-men of the said County are required to attend at the Time and Place of assembling appointed as aforesaid. And if any Militia-man of the said County (not labouring under any Infirmary incapacitating him) shall not appear at the Time and Place aforesaid, he will forfeit the Sum of Twenty Pounds, which if not immediately paid, he will be liable to be committed to the Common Goal of the said County for Six Months, or until he has paid the said Penalty.
