WARWICKSHIRE MILITIA.

September 3, 1777.

THE Deputy-Lieutenants of the County of Warwick, at a General Meeting held this Day, have ordered that the Militia of the said County fhall afsemble and meet at Stratford upon Avon in the said County, on Saturday the 20th of September inftant, to be trained and exercifed for Twenty-eight Days together, at the said Place, or at fuch other Place or Places in the said County as fhall be hereafter appointed by the Lord Lieutenant of the said County and the said Deputy-Lieutenants, or in the Abfence of the Lord Lieutenant by the said Deputy-Lieutenants. And all the Militia-men of the said County are required to attend at the Time and Place of afsembling appointed as aforefaid. And if any Militia-man of the said County (not labouring under any Infirmitiy incapacitating him) fhall not appear at the Time and Place aforefaid, he will forfeit the Sum of Twenty Pounds, which if not immediately paid, he will be liable to be committed to the Common Goal of the said County for Six Months, or until he has paid the said Penalty.
