For continuing the Encouragements to Seamin who shall enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, and the Rewards for discovering such Sea-men as shall conceal themselves; and also for giving Encouragement to such Able-bodied Landmen who shall enter into His Majefty's Service at Sca.

THEREAS, by Our Royal Proclamation, dated the 25th Day of October last, intitu-Wy dated the 25th Day of October lait, influe-led, A Proclamation for encouraging Seamen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of War, We were graciously pleased to promife, That every Able Seaman, and every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fit for Our Searcise who foculd voluntarily enter themfelves Our Service, who should voluntarily enter themselves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, on or before the 31ft Day of December laft, in fuch Manner as in Our faid Proclamation is required, fhould respectively receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the respective Sums expressed in Our faid Proclamation; (that is to fay) Every Able Scaman the Sum of Five Pounds, and every Ordinary Seaman the Sum of Two Pounds Ten Shillings, in lieu of all other Bounties men-tioned in Our Proclamation dated the zzd Day of March then laft, and Our Orders in Council of the Ift of May, the 21ft of June, and the 21ft of Au-gust following; and whereas, by Our fubfequent Proclamation, dated the 8th Day of November laft, intituled, A Proclamation for recalling and prohi-biting Seamen from ferving Foreign Princes and States; and for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal themselves; We did farther promife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen thould be taken for Our faid Service, by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the faid 31th Day of December last; the faid Rewards to be paid in fuch Manner as in Our faid last-mentioned Proclamation is directed: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the 31st Day of this inflant August; and it being judged expedient for Our Service, that the faid Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for fome Time longer, and that Encourage-ment fhould be given to Able bodied Landmen to enter into Our Service at Sea; We do therefore, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby promife and declare. That the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties to fuch Seamen as shall voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, and Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen who shall conceal themselves, shall be pro-longed and extended from the faid 31st Day of this

That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of I wenty Years, who shall voluntarily enter themselves to ferve on Board any of Our Ships, on or before the laid 31st Day of October next, shall receive, as of Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man; all which respective Sums are hereby required to be paid in the Manner directed by Our aforefaid Proclamations aforefaid Proclamations.

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 21th Day of May latt, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this King-dom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt-petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this inftant August : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-hibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d and 27th of October, and of the 6th and zzd of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the z3d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April last, and the 13th of this inftant August, has thought proper to permit and allow the Ex-portation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gust-powder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Retrictions mentioned in the faid Orders - His Maielly doth therefore by the faid Orders : His Majelly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, here-by order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whomsoever (except the Masser-General, Licutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inflant August, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coatewife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gun-powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carry-ing the same Coastwile, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th inftant August to the 31st Day of October next : and 19th of February, and the 23d of August And We do hereby further promise and declare, and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th

of April last, and the 13th of this instant Au-1 guft, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefty to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower "His Majefty to restrain the carrying Coastwife " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife " of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or Ammunition." — And the Lords Commif-fioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.
