The same Evening the Empress came to Town; and on Sunday Morning her Imperial Majesty went to Mass at the Chapel of the Preobrazensky Guards, (it being the Anniversary Festival of that Regiment:) After which there was a Court at the Summer-Palace, and the Officers of the said Regiment had the Honour to dine with the Empress as usual. In the Evening her Imperial Majesty returned to Zarco Zelo.
