**A** PLACART has been published to prohibit the Importation of Rye from Foreign Parts into the King of Denmark's German Dominions, for the ensuing Year, under Pain of Confiscation.

The infectious Distemper among Horned Cattle having again broken out with great Violence in some Parts of the Danish Dominions, particularly in Lolland and Falster, a Placart was issued the First of this Month, setting forth the Danger of the Infection being communicated by the Importation of Hides, Calves Skins, unmelted Tallow, Hay, Straw, and other Fodder, Living Creatures, Wool and Woollen Manufactures, Flax, Hemp, and Tow, and Things packed therein; and therefore prescribing several Precautions to be used; and, among others, prohibiting the Admission into the Danish Harbours, of any Ships or other Vessels, without producing the proper Certificates of Health from the Places they come from, or at which they may have touched during their Voyage.
