WE, taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary Measures of Force which We are obliged to use against Our Rebellious Subjects in Our Colonies and Provinces in North America; and putting Our Trust in Almighty God, that He will vouchsafe a special Blessing on Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have resolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Friday the Twenty-seventh Day of February next; that so both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and solemn Manner, send up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments, which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deserved, and for imploring His Intervention and Blessing, speedily to deliver Our loyal Subjects, within Our Colonies and Provinces in North America, from the Violence, Injustice and Tyranny of those daring Rebels, who have assumed to themselves the Exercise of Arbitrary Power; to open the Eyes of those who have been deluded by specious Falsehoods into Acts of Treason and Rebellion; to turn the Hearts of the Authors of these Calamities; and finally to restore Our People in those distracted Provinces and Colonies to the happy Condition of being Free Subjects of a Free State, under which heretofore they flourished so long and prospered so much: And We do strictly charge and command, That the said Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious a Duty. And for the better and more orderly solemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship; and to take Care the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceses.

And We do strictly charge and command, That the said Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That incontinent this Our Proclamation seen, ye pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We appoint them to send Doubles hereof to the several Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

Petersburg, January 6. On the 31st of last Month, being the Day appointed for the Baptism of the Infant Prince, the Ladies of the Bed-chamber, Maids of Honour, Great Officers, Nobility of the Five First Classes of both Sexes, and the Foreign Ministers, assembled at Eleven o'Clock in the Apartment of the *Chevaliers Gardes*; (the Ladies being dressed in the Russian Habits, and the Gentlemen in their Gala Cloaths as usual,) when the young Great Duke was brought from the Apartments to the Chapel of the Palace, in the following Order:

The Harbinger, or *Fourrier* of the Chamber.
 The Grand Master and Master of the Ceremonies.
 The Gentlemen of the Bed-chamber and Chamberlains of her Imperial Majesty, Two and Two.
 The Persons occupying the Three First Employments of the Court, and the Members of the Council, Two and Two.
 The Marshal of the Court, and the Person who officiates for the Second Marshal, with their Staves.
 Her Imperial Majesty, two Adjutant-Generals a little before her on each Side.
 The Great Duke.

The Dutches of Courland, bearing the newborn Prince on a Cushion, supported on one Side by M. Mariskin, Cup-bearer, and on the other by General Soltikow.

Ladies of the Bed-chamber, Maids of Honour, and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes.

The Baptism was administered by her Imperial Majesty's Confessor. Te Deum was chanted, with the Firing of 301 Guns, and the Ringing of all the Bells. Mass was then celebrated, during which her Imperial Majesty presented the Infant Great Duke at the Altar, to receive the Eucharist: Afterwards the dignified Clergy performed a solemn Thanksgiving, and were admitted to compliment her Imperial Majesty, and the Great Duke.

Her Imperial Majesty at the same Time decorated the Infant Prince with the Order of St. Andrew, and then returned to the Apartment of the *Chevaliers Gardes* in the same Manner as above; and there received the Compliments of the Nobility of the Five First Classes, and of the Foreign Ministers; afterwards they all repaired to the Apartments of the Great Duke for the same Purpose.

About Noon Dinner was served in the Hall of the *Chevaliers Gardes*; at which were present his Imperial Highness the Great Duke, the Dutches

of Courland, the Ladies of the Bedchamber, and the Nobility of the Two First Classes.
