Petersburg, February 13.

ON Wednesday last, for the Conclusion of the Publick Festivities on Occasion of the late happy Event of the Birth of a Prince, a grand Firework was played off on the Plain near the Imperial Gardens; at which the Empress and the Great Duke and Dutcheſs were present, attended by the whole Court. The Foreign Ministers and principal Nobility had Places assigned them in her Imperial Majesty's Gallery. Though the Concourse of People was very great, no Accident whatever happened; and the Design of the Firework itself, as well as the good Order with which the whole was conducted, gave general Satisfaction. The same Evening the Town was magnificently illuminated.
