St. James's, May 7, 1778. HE King and Queen fet out on the 2d Instant at Six in the Morning from the Queen's Houle, and arrived at Portlmouth about Three Quarters paft Twelve, when they were faluted by all the Guns round the Works, and the Garrison.

Their Majefties got to the Commiffioner's Houfe about One o'Clock, efcorted by a Party of the Third or Queen's Regiment of Dragoon Guards. His Majefty was attended by the Marquis of Lo thian, Gold Stick in Waiting; the Honourable Colonels St. John and Harcourt, Two of His Aid de Camps ; and Lieutenant-General Carpenter, His Equerry in Waiting: And Her Majeity by the Marquis of Carmarthen, Lord Chamberiain of Her Majeity's Houshold; and the Countels of Figremont, One of the Ladies of Her Bed-chamber. The Standard was immediately hoifted in the Dock-yard, and the Workmen affembled, and gave Their Ma-jefties feveral Cheers as they paffed. Their Majefties were received at the Door of the Commiffioner's House by the Earl of Sandwich, Lord Amherft, Lieutenant General Monckton, the Commiffioners of the Num, and the Commifficance of Officers of of the Navy. and the Commissioner and Officers of the Yard. His Majesty left the House at Half pass Five o'Clock in the Afternoon, to visit the Yard; walked through the Deal-yard; viewed the Warriour of Seventy four Guns, building; paffed the Stern of the Marlborough of Seventy four Guns, in Dock repairing; viewed the Lyon and Vigilant of Sixty-four Guns in the Bason, and the Centaur of Seventy-four Guns, all fitting for Sea. Several of the Artificers were affembled, and fang in full Chorus the Songs of God fave the King, Fam. Lt the Trumpet Jourd, and Britons firike home: After which they gave His Majesty Three Cheers. His Majesty then looked at the Fox of Twenty-eight Gun, preparing to be theathed with Copper; paf-fea the Stern of the Burford of Seventy Guns, in the Dock refitting; viewed the Refervoir, and the Works in the Boat-house Channel; then proceeded to the New Ground, where the St. George of Ninety Guns was building, also the Leopard of Fifty Guns on a new Slip. The Company of the Fifty Guns on a new Slip. The Company of the Refolution of Seventy-four Guns, which lay oppo-fite, gave Three Cheers as His Majesty passed. His Majesty faw the Crocodile and Eurydice of Twenty-four Guns each, building; He hen went into the Smith's Shop, where the Men were em ployed on a large Anchor; then into the Boat houfes; and re urned to the Commissioner's House about Seven o'Clock.

Sunday, May 3. At Ten o'Clock Their Majeffies went to the Garrifon Chapel, where They heard Divine Service, and a Sermon preached by the Reverend Mr. Cuthbert. After which Their Majesties had a Public Leveé at the Governor's House, and were waited on by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Corporation of Portsmouth; and the Recorder first addreffed His Majefty in the following Words:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sowereign,

WE, your Majefty's most faithful Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgeffes of Portf-mouth, beg Leave at this critical Conjuncture to tender our Sentiments of Duty and Affection to

your Majefly, and our inviolable Attachment to our free and happy Conflitution. Anxious for the Glory of your Majesty's Reign, and for the Prosperity of every Part of your Dominions, we obierve with the deepest Concern the Progress of the prefent dangerous and alarming Troubles in America. We therefore most humbly implore your Majesty, gracioufly to permit us to exprets our most fervent Hopes, that Providence will grant Succefs to your Endeavours for effecting a speedy Restoration of Peace and Tranquility; and that You may enjoy a long and prosperous Reign over a free and happy People.

This Address was very graciously received by His Majesty.

They were afterwards introduced to the Queen, and addreffed Her Majefty in the following Words:

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Burgeffes of Portfmouth.

WE, your Majefty's most faithful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Burgeffes of Portfmouth, embrace with great Joy and Satisfaction this happy Opportunity of expresiing our Zeal and Affection to your Majesty's Perfon, and our Gratitude for the Honour your Ma-jefty has done this Place by your Prefence.

The Pleafure, Madam, we feel upon this Occa-fion is greatly increafed, when we reflect that we are paying our Duty to a Princefs, whole Virtues adorn her Sex, and whole Example, we hope, will be productive of much public and private Happinefs in the Kingdoms.

It is our fincere Prayer, Madam, that your Ma-jefty may long continue to be the Ornament and Delight of this Country; and that the Throne of Britain may be filled by your Royal Progeny to the latell Pollerity.

Her Majesty was pleased to receive this Address with the greatest Affability and Condescension. The Mayor, Aldermen, Recorder, and Corporation, had then the Honour of kiffing Their Majesties Hands. The Admirals and Captains of the Fleet, and the Officers of the Army, were prefented at the Leveé, were graciously received, and had the Honour to kiss I heir Mijefties Hands; as were a very great Number of the Nobili y and Gentry of the Neighbourhood, and from other Parts.

Monday, May 4. The King left the Yard at Seven this Morning, and went to the Gun-wharf; viewed the Ordnance Stores, and Store houses; and returned to the Yard about Eight o'Clock At a returned to the Yard about Eight o'Clock At a Quarter paft Nine, the Queen went in the Barge to the Yacht, which lay Half-way to Spithead, at-tended by the Counters of Egremont, the Earl of Sandwich, and the Marquis of Carmarthen. The Barge was preceded by Admiral Pye with his Flag flying, and followed by the other Admirals and Captains in their Boats, drawn up in Four regular Lines, amounting to Fifty Boats. The Sandwich, of Ninety Guns, Elizabeth, Cumberland and Ber-wick, of Seventy four Guns each and Pallas of wick, of Seventy-four Guns each. and Pallas of Thirty fix in Harbour, manned Ships, and gave Her Majefty Three Cheers as the Barge paffed. On getting

getting out of the Harbour, the Guns of the Platform, the Block-house, Fort, and South Sea Caffle, faluted Her Majesty as She passed. Her Majesty got on Board the Yacht at Half patt Nine. All the All the Ships at Spithead were manned, and the Fleet fa-luted Her Majesty with Twenty-one Guns each. At a Quarter past Ten the Barge returned to the Dock-yard, and His Majesty embarked on Board her; attended by the Admirals and Captains in their Boats, in the fame Manner as Her Majefty: The Marquis of Lothian, Lord Amherst, the Honour-able Colonel Harcourt and Colonel St. John, and Lieutenant-General Carpenter, were in the Boat with the King; the Ships in the Harbour gave Three Cheers as His Majesty passed; and He was faluted by the Platform, Block-house, and South Sea Caffle

On the King's Arrival at Spithead, all the Ships were manned, and faluted His Majefty. His Ma-jefty was rowed through the Fleet, and received Three Cheers as He paffed each Ship. His Majefty was also saluted by a great Number of Merchant-ships which lay in Stokes Bay. At Half past At Half paft Eleven the King went on Board the Prince George of Ninety Guns, (Admiral Keppel) where the Standard was immediately hoisted, the Fleet faluting with Twenty one Guns each. The Yacht with Her Majesty on Board, attended

by the Earl of Sandwich, the Marquis of Carmarthen, and the Counters of Egremont, failed round the Fleet; the Ships were all manned, and gave Three Cheers as the Yacht paffed.

At Half past Twelve the Fleet faluted the Queen with Twenty-one Guns each Ship, as Her Majefty paffed by the Prince George, where the Royal Stand-ard was flying, the King being on Board. His Majefty, during His Stay on Board, faw the Men at their Quarters, when they performed their feveral Exercifes of the Great Guns and Small Arms; after which His Majefty received all the Captains of the Fleet upon the Quarter Deck. At One o'Clock the King left the Prince George, and went into His Barge, receiving Three Cheers. The Barge was preceded by Admiral Pye in his Barge, and followed by the Admirals and Captains in the Fleet in their Barges, and went on Board the Yacht, which lay at Anchor to Windward of the Fleet, at Half past One, where Their Majesties dined, the King under an Awning on the Quarter Deck; the Flag Officers, Generals, and those of His Majesty's Suite, having the Honour to dine at His Table.

At Half past past Four the Queen's Health was drank, followed by a General Salute from the Fleet of Twenty-one Guns each. The fame Salute was repeated a few Minutes after, when His Majefly drank to the Prosperity of the Navy, and to all His good Subjects by Sea and Land.

The King went into His Barge at Six o'Clock, and rowed round the Fleet ; each Ship manned, and gave Three Cheers as His Majefly passed by : He then returned on Board the Yacht, and came into the Harbour, being faluted by the whole Fleet, and the feveral Forts as before, and by a Number of Cannon from the Shores of Portfmouth and Gof-Their Majellies left the Yacht at Half paft port. Their Majellies left the Yacht at Half paft Eight, landed at the Dock-yard, and went to the Commissioner's House.

The Day being very fine, an incredible Number of Veffels, Fleafure Yachts and Boats attended their Majeflies; and on their Return in the Evening, all the Houles of Portfmouth and Gosport were illuminated, as they had been the preceding Even. ang

Pertfmouth, Tuefday May 5. His Majefty came from the Commissioner's House at Half past Six o'Clock this Morning, and walked to the Burford of Seventy Guns, and down into the Dock to see the Workmen drive the Treenails and caulk her Bottom; then to the Centaur of Seventy-four Guns; and into the Dock to fee the Shipwrights

put on the Sheathing. At Nine o'Clock Their Majeslies left the Yard, and went to the Glacis near South-Sea Common,

where His Majefty reviewed the 25th Regiment of Foot commanded by Lieutenant - General Lord George Lenox. The Regiment went through their feveral Manœuvres with the greatest Exactness and

Regularity. The Queen afterwards came to the Garrifon, alighted at the Platform, and walked along the Ramparts to a Bastion, where a Pavilion was erected for Her Accommodation, from whence Her Majefty had a full View of the Fleet at Spithead. A prodigious Concourse of Gentry and People assembled on this Occasion.

Her Majefty returned to the Commissioner's House about One o'Clock.

His Majefty went from the Review to fee the new Fortifications erecting round the Common for the better Protection of the Dock-yard, and re-turned about Half paft One, amidft the Acclamations of many thousand People who attended Him the whole Way.

At Six o'Clock His Majefly faw the Rope-houfes, and feveral other Store-houfes; then went to the. Academy, looked at the Model of the former Victory of One Hundred Guns, and then paffed into the School, and examined the Drawings and Per-formances of the Young Gentlemen, which He honoured with His Approbation; from hence He returned to the new Rope-house, and visited the Remainder of the Storehoufes; afterwards walked through the Yard to the new Ground, went into the St. George of Ninety Guns, whole Frame is nearly compleated, and returned to the Commiffioner's House at a Quarter past Eight o'Clock.

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Roval Proclamatic by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the 31ft of December then follow. ing, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might secrete themselves, that so such seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service, by any of His Majefty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the 31st Day of De-cember, 1776. And whereas His Majefty was like-wife pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August last, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould voluntarily enter himfelf to ferve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed. And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 30th Day of this instant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majetty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 30th Day of this inflant April to the 30th Day of June next, inclu-five. — Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have been apprehended, and are now in Goal, or in Regimental Cuftody: His Majefty is likewife pleafed to grant to them His Free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit, upon their. Arrival at their respective Regiments, or upon their being enlifted by fome other Corps or Recruiting Party.

Any Soldier who may desert, after these His Majelty's most gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.
