The Garden behind his Excellency's House was finely illuminated, and the Company did not separate till late this Morning, expressing the greatest Satisfaction at their splendid Entertainment.

Their Serene and Royal Highnesses remove this Evening from their Residence in this Town to their Palace in the Hague Wood; and to-morrow the Prince Stadtholder sets out to visit Breda, and the neighbouring Garrisons, and intends to return hither at the End of next Week.
