**Y**ESTERDAY, being the Anniverfary of His Majesty the King of Great Britain's Birth-day, his Excellency Sir Joseph Yorke, His Britannick Majesty's Ambafador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the States General, received the Compliments of the Foreign Minifters, and the Principal Members of the Government in the Morning, and in the Evening gave a magnificent Ball and Supper upon the Occafion, which was honoured with the Prefence of their Serene and Royal Highneffes the Prince and Princels of Orange, and their Court, their Serene Highneffes Duke Lewis of Brunfwick, and Prince George of Hefle Darmftadt, the Foreign Minifters, and a great Number of the Nobility and Gentry of both Sexes.

The Garden behind his Excellency's Houfe was finely illuminated, and the Company did not feparate till late this Morning, expreffing the greateft Satisfaction at their fplendid Entertainment.

Their Serene and Royal Highneffes remove this Evening from their Refidence in this Town to their Palace in the Hague Wood; and to-morrow the Prince Stadtholder fetts out to vifit Breda, and the neighbouring Garrifons, and intends to return hither at the End of next Week.

**O**N Saturday laſt the 4th Inftant, about Eleven at Night, the Poſt-Boy was attacked and robbed, Eight Miles from York, in the Road to Malton, of the Bag of Letters from this Office of Thursday Night laſt the 2d Inftant, for Scarborough, Malton, Whitby, and other Places within the Delivery of Scarborough and Malton, and alſo of the Bag with the Bye and Roa Letters for the ſame Places.

The Perfon who committed this Robbery was then in Foot, but when he paſſed two Turnpike Gates in the Neighbourhood was mounted upon a Light Bay mottled Horſe, about Fourteen Hands and an Half high, ſtrong made; and the Bar-keepers agree with the Poſt-Boy in the Deſcription of the Robber, that he was a

ſlow:

*stout Man, Six Feet high, and thin in the Face, with Black Stockings, Waistcoat and Breeches, and Brown Copper-coloured Coat; his own short curled Hair powdered, with a round Hat, two Sides of it tied up; and the Post-Boy observed, whilst he lay with his Hands and Feet bound in a Field adjoining the Road, that the Robber put the Bills, &c. which he took out of the Letters, into the inside Pocket of his light Great Coat.*

*Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be intitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.*
