Pera of Constantinople, May 18.
THE Plague has raged with great Violence in this Village, and in Constantinople, for these Ten or Twelve Days past: The Grand Seignor left the Seraglio in great Haste on the 13th, it being discovered that this cruel Disorder had made it's Appearance in the private Apartments or Haram. It is said that no less than 500 People have already died in the Seraglio, and near 40 in the Captain Pacha's Palace.

The following Address having been transmitted by his Excellency the Earl of Buckinghamshire, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, to the Lord Viscount Weymouth, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been presented to His Majesty: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the High Sheriff and Grand Jury of the County of Tyrone, assembled at Omagh at Spring Assizes the 11th Day of April, 1778.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Imprest with the strongest Gratitude for the many Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty's most gracious Government, we should hold ourselves wanting in our Duty, if we omitted, at this Period, to offer to your Majesty the strongest Assurances of our Loyalty and Affection.

Under your Majesty's auspicious Reign, when the Safety and Happiness of your People are Objects that ever call forth your Royal Attention, we flatter ourselves that a well regulated Militia, by arming your Majesty's Protestant Subjects of this Kingdom, and enabling them to repel all Attempts of their natural Enemy, will meet with your Majesty's Royal Approbation.

We venture to assure your Majesty, if at any Time the internal Safety or Quiet of this Kingdom shall be disturbed, that your Majesty will find us ready to stand forth with our Lives and Properties in Support of the Honour and Dignity of the Crown, and your Majesty's Royal Person and Government.
