**T**HIS Day His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons being sent for, gave the Royal Assent to the following Bills:

*An Act for granting and continuing to His Majesty the several Duties, Rates and Impositions therein mentioned, for the Use of the Corporation for promoting and carrying on an Inland Navigation in Ireland.*

*An Act to explain the Statute of the Twenty-eighth Year of Henry the Eighth, intitled the Act of Faculties.*

*An Act for the better Preservation of Fish, in Rivers, Lakes, and Inland Waters.*

*An Act for regulating the Price and Assize of Bread, and preventing Frauds and Impositions in the Sale of Flour, Meal, Beer, Ale, Potatoes, Butchers Meat, and other Articles sold by Weight or Measure in the County of Dublin.*

*An Act to prevent Mischief that arise from driving Cattle within the City of Dublin and Liberties thereof.*

*An Act to continue an Act, passed in the Eleventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act to oblige Ships more effectually to perform their Quarentine, and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from foreign Parts into Ireland, and to hinder the spreading of Infection.*

*An Act for preserving the Health of Prisoners in Goal, and preventing the Goal Distemper.*

*An Act for the further Encouragement of the Whale Fisheries, carried on from Ireland.*

*An Act to explain and amend the Acts made for the Encouragement of the Fisheries of this Kingdom and for promoting the good Ends proposed by the said Laws.*

*An Act to amend an Act passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act to regulate the Trials of Controversed Elections, or Returns of Members to serve in Parliament.*

*An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act for encouraging the planting of Timber Trees.*

*An Act for reviving and continuing several Temporary Statutes.*

*An Act for continuing and amending an Act passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act for continuing an Act passed in the seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intitled an Act for making more effectual an Act, passed in the third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intitled an Act for repairing the Road leading from the City of Dublin to the Town of Navan, in the County of Meath; and for repairing the Road leading from the said Town of Navan to the Town of Nobber, in the said County; and also for repairing the Road leading from the said Town of Navan to the Town of Kells, in the said County.*

*An Act to direct the Application of the Sum of five Thousand Pounds, granted this Session, to the Commissioners appointed by Act of Parliament, for making wide and convenient Passages through the City of Dublin, and for the further Improvement thereof.*

*An Act to amend and continue an Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth Years of His present Majesty, intitled an Act for the better Regulation of the*

*Baking Trade in the City of Dublin and for other Purposes.*

*An Act for continuing an Act, intitled an Act for amending an Act passed in the twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intitled an Act for the further Encouragement of Tillage.*

*An Act to amend an Act, intitled an Act for enforcing a due Execution of the Laws relative to Turnpike Roads in this Kingdom.*

*An Act for preventing the cutting or destroying of plain, stained, or printed Linens, Cottons, Lawns, or Muslins, or any other manufacture Goods.*

*An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act for amending the public Roads.*

*An Act for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors.*

*An Act for the Encouragement of Tillage, and rendering the Carriage of Corn to the City of Dublin less expensive.*

*An Act for explaining a Doubt arising upon the Laws for supplying the City of Dublin with Corn and Flour; and also for lessening the Expences of supplying the said City with the Articles aforesaid.*

*An Act for establishing a Militia in this Kingdom.*

*An Act for repairing the Road leading from the Town of Maryborough, in the Queen's County, through the Towns of Mountrath, Castletown, and Borris-in-Ossory, in the same County, and from thence through the Town of Roscrea, in the County of Tipperary, and through the Town of Dunkerrin, in the King's County, to the Town of Tomiwarah, in the said County of Tipperary.*

*An Act for altering, amending, and making more effectual an Act for repairing the Road leading from the Town of Nenagh, in the County of Tipperary, through the Towns of Birr and Furbane, in the King's County, to Curranaboy Bridge, on the Turnpike Road leading to Athlone, in the County of Westmeath, and also for other Purposes therein-mentioned.*

*An Act for the better Regulation of the Police of the City of Cork, and for other Purposes relative to the said City.*

*An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act for the better Regulation of the Linen and Hempen Manufactures.*

And to two private Bills.

#### Nottinghamshire Militia.

**W**HEREAS, by an Act of Parliament made in the fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled "An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled an Act to explain, amend, and reduce into one Act of Parliament, the several Laws now in being relating to the raising and training of the Militia within that Part of Great-Britain called England," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty's Lieutenant of every County, Riding, and Place, where the Militia has been or shall be raised, together with any two or more Deputy Lieutenants, and, on the Death or Removal, or in the Absence, of His Majesty's Lieutenants; any three or more Deputy Lieutenants, whenever and as often as they shall find necessary, to summon or cause to be summoned a General Meeting, according to the Directions of the Act passed in the second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for summoning General Meetings in Counties where the Militia has not been raised, which General Meetings had been held on the last Tuesday in May, or on the last Tuesday in October in each Year, in Pursuance of the said Act:

And whereas the Time for which the Men now serving in the Militia will expire in the Months of August, September, and October next: Notice is hereby given, that a General Meeting will be held at the Swan Inn in Mansfield, on Wednesday the Twenty-ninth Day of this present Month, at Eleven o'Clock in the Morning, in order to put the Militia Laws into Execution; at which Time and Place the Deputy Lieutenants of the said County are requested to attend.
