Berlin, July 11.

**B**Y the last Accounts from the King of Prussia, which are dated the 7th Instant, his Majesty had entered Bohemia, and was then at Nachod, between Glatz and Konigsgratz; at the latter of which Places the Austrians are strongly entrenched.

*Dresden, July 12.* A Corps of Prussians, under the Command of General Moellendorff, is cantoned near Plauen; and 50,000 Men of Prince Henry of Prussia's Army are encamped near the same Village, within a Quarter of a Mile of this City; the Right Wing being close to the Village, and extending itself towards the River Elbe; the Artillery is in the Center, and consists of about 400 Pieces of Cannon. The Remainder of his Royal Highness's Army, with the Hussars, is stationed in the neighbouring Villages, at a very small Distance from this Capital. Prince Henry's Head Quarters are at a House called Reitzewitz, near Plauen, belonging to the late Count de Vilzthum.
