*Petersburg, August 4:*

**S**UNDAY being the Name-day of her Imperial Highness the Great Dutchess, there was a masked Ball and Illuminations at Peterhoff; and this Day the Court removes from that Place to Zarfco-Zelo.

*Dresden, August 16.* By our last Accounts from his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia's Army, his Head Quarters were at Nimes, and his advanced Parties were in Possession of Leitmeritz, towards which Place General Platen's Corps is likewise moved. General Moellendorff's Corps forms the Right Wing of Prince Henry's Army, and General Solms's the Left.

*Berlin, August 18.* His Prussian Majesty has conferred the Order of the Black Eagle, and a Pension, upon Lieutenant-General Belling, Commander of a Regiment of Hussars, in Consideration of his gallant Behaviour in the late Action near Gabel. The Officers of his Regiment have also been rewarded by Promotions, and other Marks of Distinction.

The latest Advices from the Army under the Command of the King of Prussia are of the 13th, when his Majesty remained in the Camp at Welfdorff, in the Neighbourhood of Jaromirz. His Royal Highness Prince Henry on the 14th continued encamped at Nimes; Lieutenant-General Moellendorff's Corps near Neuschlofs; Lieutenant-General Platen had taken Post with his Division near Lofowitz; and Major-General Sobek at Leitmeritz.

Lieutenant-General Stutterheim (who commands a separate Body on the Confines of Moravia) early in the Morning of the 11th Instant, with a Part of Werner's Regiment of Hussars, and Finckenstein's and Apenburg's Dragoons, surprized the Imperial Regiment of Wirtemberg Dragoons, and a Division of the Regiment of Dragoons of Jung Modena, which were encamped between Troppau, Heidepiltich, and Hof, near Glomnitz. The Loss of the Austrians in Killed and Wounded is considerable. 1 Field-Officer, 5 Subalterns, and 350 Private Men, are made Prisoners. A great Number of Horses, together with the Field Equipage of the Commanding Officer General Knebel, fell into the Hands of the Prussians, who plundered the Camp.

*Dresden, August 19.* The Corps of Prussians, under the Generals Werner and Stutterheim, continue at Creutzendorff; and the Marquis de Botta, who is opposed to them, is encamped at Heidepiltich and Spachendorff near Hoff, and had pushed his light Troops as far as Gratz.

When the last Accounts came away, the Positions of the Army on this Side were as follow: His Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia at Nimes, with his advanced Post at Hunerwasser; General Solms at Reichenberg; General Belling at Wartenberg; and General Moellendorff at Neuschlofs. General Platen, with his Corps, is at Lowositz; General Sobek at Leitmeritz; and the Saxon General Carlburg at Linai, in order to keep the Communication open with General Moellendorff's Corps, and to observe the Motions of the Austrian General Riefe, who is posted at Melnick. Marshal Laudohn has got nearer to Jung Buntzel, his Head Quarters being at Kofmanos; and he has been reinforced by ten Battalions from the Emperor's Army.

Prince Henry has ordered all his heavy Baggage to retire two Miles to the Rear of his Army.
