Extract of a Letter from General Sir Henry Clinton, Knight of the Bath, to Lord George Germain, dated New York, July 27, 1778:

HAD the Honour of writing to your Lordfhip. on the 19th Inflant, by way of Halifax, and took that Opportunity to transmit Duplicates of my Difpatches, fent by the Grantham Express Boat. There were fome Days fince Appearances, which feemed to indicate an Intention of a general Attack upon this Place, in order to co-operate with the French Fleet; but as they have quitted their Station near Sandy Hook, and General Washington has reinforced Sullivan, it is more than probable that Rhode Island is become their Object; however as that Place and been re-inforced with Major General Prescott and five Battalions; and Major General Pigot, with the great Assistance he has met with from the Navy, has had time to put the Sea Defences in a tolerable State; it is to be hoped that he will be able, at least for a Time, to refift the Attack. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October 1776, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who thould, on or before the 31ft of December then follow ing, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board Men for the Service of the Royal Navy. And whereas His Majefly was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of No vember, 1776, to promise and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might fecrete themselves, that so fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the 31th Day of December, 1776. And whereas His Majefty was like-wife plealed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August 1777, to promife and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter himfelf to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed. And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31st Day of this instant August; and it being judged expedient

for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and-Rewards fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this inflant August to the 31ft Day of October next, inclufive. — Whereof all Perfors concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 22d of May last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant August : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-hibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ufe and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of July last, and the 7th of this Instant August, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gun-powder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whomfoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majelly's Ser-vice) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inflant August, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, except in the Cafes comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incursing and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act " to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-" portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefty to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and also to impower " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife " of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms 64 OT
