fuperior Commission or Office. And We do hereby flricily enjoin all Commanders of Our Ships and Veffels of War taking any Prize, as foon as may be, to transmit, or cause to be transmitted, to the Commiffioners of Our Navy, a true Lift of the Names of all the Officers, Seamen, Marines, Sol-diers, and others, who were actually on Board Our Ships and Vesiels of War under their Command at the Time of the Capture ; which Lift fhall contain the Quality of the Service of each Perfon on Board. and be fubicribed, by the Captain or Commanding Officer, and Three or more of the Chief Officers on Board. And We do hereby require and direct the Commiffioners of Our Navy, or any Three or more of them, to examine, or caule to be exa-mined, fuch Lifts by the Muster-Books of fuch Ships and Veffels of War, and Lifts annexed theretry, to fee that fuch Lifts do agree with the faid Muffer-Books and annexed Lifts, as to the Names, Qualities, or Ratings, of the Officers, Seamen, Marines, Soldiers, and others belonging to fuch Ships and Veffels of War, and upon Request forthwith to grant a Certificate of the Fruth of any Lift tranfmitted to them, to the Agents nominated and ap pointed by the Captors, to take care and difficie of fuch Prize; and alfo upon Application to them (the faid Commificieners) they fhall give, or caufe to be giver, to the faid Agents, all fuch Lifts from the Mufer-Books of any fuch Ships of War, and annexed Lifes, as the faid Agents shall find requisite for their Direction in paying the Produce of fuch Prizes, and therwife that be aiding and affilling to the faid Agents in all fuch Matters as shall be neteffary. We do hereby further Will and Direct, ne ceífary. that the following Regulations shall be observed concerning the One Eighth Part herein before mentioned to be granted to the Flag, or Flag Officers, who shall actually be on Board at the taking of any Prize, or shall be directing or affilting therein : First, That a Flag Officer, Commander in Chief, when there is but One Flag Officer spon Service, shall have to his own Ufe the faid One Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by Ships and Veffels under his Command : Secondly, That a Flag Officer, fent to command at Jamaica, or elfewh-re, ihall have no Right to any Share of Prizes taken by Ships or Vestels employed there, before he arrives at the Place to which he is fent, and actually takes upon him the Command: Thirdly, That when an inferior Flag Officer is fent out to reinforce a fuperior Flag Officer at Jamaica, or elfewhere, the fuperior Fing Officer shall have no Right to any Share of Prizes taken by the inferior Flag Officer, before the interior Flag Officer fhall arrive within the Limits of the Command of the fuperior Flag Officer, and actually receive tome Order from him : Fourthly, That a Chief Flag Officer returning Home from lamaica, or elfewhere, shall have no Share of the Prizes taken by the Ships or Veffels left behind to act under another Command : Fifthly, That if a Flag Officer is fent to command in the Out-Ports of this Kingdon, he shall have no Share of the Pilzes taken by Ships or Veffels which have failed from that Port by Order from the Admiralty: Sixthly, That when more Flag Of ficers than One ferve together, the Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by any Ships or Veffels of the Fleet or Squadron fnall be divided in the following Proportions, viz. If there be but Two Hag Officers, the Chief fhall have Two Third Parts of the faid One Eighth Part, and the other fhall have the remaining Third Part ; but if the Number of Flag Officers be more than Two, the Chief shall have only One Half, and the other Half shall be equally divided amongst the other Flag Officers : Seventhly, That Commodores with Captains under them shall be esteemed as Flag Officers with respect to the Eighth Part of Prizes taken, whether commanding 'n Chief, or ferving under Com-mand. And We do hereby further Order, That in the Cafe of Cutters, Schooners, and other armed Vessels commanded by Lieutenants, the Share of fuch Lieutenants shall be Three Eighth Parts of the Prize, unless fuch Lieutenants shall be under the Command of a Flag Officer or Officers; in which

Cafe the Flag Officer or Officers shall have One of the faid Three Eighths, to be divided among fuch Flag Officer or Flag Officers in the Manner herein-before directed in the Cafe of Captains ferving un-der Flag Officers : Secondly, We direct that the Share of the Mafter, or other Perion acting as Second in Command, and the Pilo:, (if there happens to be One on Board) shall be One Eighth Part, to be divided into Three equal Paris; of which Two Thirds shall go to the Master, or other Person acting as Second in Command, and the remaining One Third to the Pilot; but if th re is no Filot, then tuch Eighth Part to go wholly to the Mader or Perion acting as Second in Command : That the Share of the Chirurgeon, or Chirurgeon's Mate, (where there is no Chirurgeon) Midthipmen, and Clerk and Steward, that be One Eighth; That the Share of the Boattwain's, Gunner's, and Carpenter's Males, Yeomen of the Sheets, Sailmaker, Quarter-Matter, and Quarter Matter's Mate, Ihall be One Highth; and the Share of the Seamen. Marines, and other Pertons on Board, affifting in the Capture, shall be Two Eighth Parts. But it is Our Int ntion neverthelefs, that the above Diffri-bution shall only extend to fuch Captures as shall be made by any Cutter, Schooner, or armed Vessel, without any of His Majeffy's Ships or Veffels of War being pretent or within Sight of, and adding to the Encouragement of the Captors, and Terror of the Enemy: But in Cafe any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels of War fhall be prefent, or in Sight, that then the Officers, Pilots, Petty Officers, and Men on Board fuch Cutters and Schooners, or armed Vessels, shall share in the fame Proportion as is allowed to Perfons of the like Rank and Denomination on Board His Majefty's Ships and Vefteis of War. Laftly, It is Our Will and Pleafure, t'hat this Our Declaration, and Order in Council thereupon, shall extend not only to Captures from the French King, his Subjects, and others inhabit-ing his Countries, but also shall extend in the like Manner to all Ships and Goods now taken, and not finally adjudged and condemned, and divided, or to be taken hereafter, under the Act of Parliament of the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign ; whereby it is enacted, That, for the Encouragement of Our Officers of Our Ships of War, the Flag Officers, Captains, Commanders, and other Commissioned Officers in Our Pay, and the Scamen, Marines, and Soldiers on Board, shall have the fole Interest and Property of and in all and every such Ships and Goods as therein are recited, which they fhall feize and take; but being first adjudged, that is to fay, finally adjudged lawful Prize, and which are by the faid Act declared forfeited to Us, and to be divided and disposed of in such Proportion and after fuch Manner as We, Our Heirs and Succeffors, shall by Proclamation or Proclamations Order and Direct.

Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this prefent Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly
