AT the Court at St. James's, the 18th Day of November, 1778, PRESENT,

The KIN G's Molt Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 19th Day of August last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this inftant November : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-hibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Be-nefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Vietualling Veffels employed in His Majeity's Service) His Majeity, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of August, and the 3d and toth of October, 1777, of the roth of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Ex-portation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gunpow-der, Saltpette, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Refrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whomsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inftant November, prefume to transport into any Parts' out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaft-wife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gun powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Am-munition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carry-ing the fame Coaffwife, except in the Cafes com prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permillion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fusiering the telpective Forfeitures and Penzities inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of

His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, " An Act "is late Majerty's Reign, entitlied, "An Act "to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefty to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower "His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition." — And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commif-fioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Stockbolm, November 3. On Sunday the M In-ftant, about Seven o'Clock in the Morning, her Swed fh Majefty was happily delivered of a Prince. This joyful Event was announced to the Publick by, the Difcharge of above Two Thouland Cannon. Her Majesty and the young Prince are as well as can be expected.

Vienna, November 4: By the last Letters from Silesia we are informed, that the two Armies are still in the fame Polition.

Duke Albert of Saxe-Teichen arrived here fome Days ago from the Army, as did likewife the Marshals Lacy and Laudohn, and also Prince Charles of Lichtenstein within these Eight and Forty Hours.

His Imperial Majefty remains at Prague, or as Brandeis, where he has fixed his Head Quarters.

Vienna, November 11. The Troops on all Sides being fettled in Winter Quarters, we hear that the Emperor will haften his Return to Vienna. His Imperial Majesty is to be on the 15th Instant at Heydenpiltz, the Head Quarters of General El-richshausen, and will afterwards employ a Day or two in vifiting the Out-Pofts in that Neighbourhood, and the Fortress of Olmutz.

Drefden, November 11. The King of Pruffia is arrived at Breflau. Prince Frederick of Brunfwick commands at Jagerndorff; and the Heréditary Prince has extended his Troops towards Tefchen.

The King has been pleased to grant unto John Henley, otherwife called John Hare, of Docking in the County of Norfolk, Efq; and to his alface, His Royal Licence to take and use the Surname of Hare, and also to bear and use the Arms of Hare, (the fame being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office;) and likewile to order, that this His Ma-jefty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in His Majefty's College of Arms.
