THE Ceremony of the Baptism of the Prince Royal was performed on the 10th instant with great Solemnity in the King's Chapel, the States being Godfather, and giving his Royal Highness the Name of Guttavus Adolphus: The next Day the King received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, the States, and all the different Orders, Civil and Military, and afterwards dined in Publick.
