*Translation of an Ordinance of the Empress Queen, concerning Prizes made at Sea, and brought into the Ports of Flanders. Brussells, the 16th of December, 1778.*

**M**ARIA Theresia, by the Grace of God, Empress Dowager of the Romans, Queen of Germany, Hungary, Bohemia, &c. &c. We being informed, that for some Time past Foreign Armed Ships, either forced by Necessity, or from other Circumstances, come frequently into the Ports of our Province of Flanders, alone, or with the Ships and Effects they have taken from the Enemies of their Nation; and being desirous to prevent these Foreign Ships from abusing the Liberty of our Ports, and to obviate at the same Time the Difficulties which their irregular or misplaced Proceedings may occasion with Powers in Amity or Alliance with us, we have, by the Advice of our Trusty and Well-beloved the Chief and President, and Members of our Privy Council, and Consideration of our Most Dear and Well-beloved Brother-in-law and Cousin, Charles Alexander, Duke of Lorraine and Bar, Grand Master of the Teutonic Order, our Lieutenant, Governor, and Captain-General of the Low Countries, ordained and decreed, and do hereby ordain and decree, the Points and Articles following.

#### Article I.

All Armed Vessels under Foreign Commission shall, on their Arrival in our Roads or Ports, hoist the Flag of the Nation to which they belong.

#### II.

The Commanders of such Ships shall be obliged, on their Arrival in any of our Ports, to present to the First Judge of the Admiralty of the Place, the Commission by virtue of which they navigate, to declare to him the Reason of their coming into such Port; and, in Case they bring in any Prize, they shall make known where and from what Nation it was taken, and with what Kinds of Merchandizes in general it is laden.

#### III.

They shall likewise transmit to the First Judge of the Admiralty the Papers found on Board the Prize, to the End that it may be the more easily discovered, whether amongst the Effects and Merchandizes of such Ship, there are any belonging to our Subjects, which, in such Case, shall be restored to them, conformably to the 18th Article of the Ordinance of the 21st of August, 1702.

#### IV.

The Commanders and Crews of such Foreign Ships, whilst in our Roads or Ports, shall abstain from all Violence or Force, by which any Person, whether our Subject or a Stranger, may suffer any Injury or Damage, on Pain to the Offenders, not only of not receiving any Assistance in our Roads or Ports, but also of being compelled by all Methods to depart out of them, independently of the Punishment that may be inflicted on them, according to the Circumstances.

#### V.

If the Crews, who commit any Violence or Force of this Kind, belong to a Ship which shall have entered into our Roads or Havens, without hoisting the Flag of the Nation to which they belong, they shall be treated and punished as Pirates.

#### VI.

The Commanders or Masters of Foreign Privateers, who shall enter into our Ports with their Ships and the Prizes which they shall have made, or with the Prizes only, shall, in every Respect, leave the Prizes in the State in which they came in, without being suffered to unlade them wholly or in Part, or to sell or alienate them; but they shall be obliged to keep them in such Manner that they may put to Sea again in the same State in which they were on their Entrance into our Ports.

#### VII.

For the better securing the Execution of the preceding Article, and likewise for repairing the Contraventions, we authorize our Judges of the Admiralty to set Guards upon the Prizes until they depart out of our Ports in order to put to Sea again.

#### VIII.

We forbid all our Subjects, as well as all other Persons in the Countries and Territories under our Dominion, to purchase, receive, unlade, transport, or conceal any of the Effects or Merchandizes laden on board any Prizes whilst in our Ports, under any Pretext whatsoever, on Pain of incurring a Fine of Six Hundred Florins, to be distributed, one Third to us, another Third to the Informer, and the remaining Third Part to the distraining Officer.

#### IX.

Finally, We will that our preceding Ordinances concerning the Admiralty and Prizes made at Sea, do remain in their full Force and Vigour, so far as the present does not derogate therefrom.

And we hereby command our Trusty and Well-beloved, the Chief, and President, and Members of our Privy Council of Flanders, our Tribunals, and Judges of the Admiralty, and all other our Justices, Officers and Subjects whom it may concern, to observe and cause to be observed this our present Ordinance in all it's Points and Articles, without permitting or suffering it to be infringed in any Manner whatsoever. For such is our Pleasure. In Witness whereof we have caused our Great Seal to be put to these Presents. Done at Brussells, &c.
