Officers who are abroad to recruit their Companies, must have them compleat, or else they forfeir their Commands. The Marquis de Grant We hear is expected in a day or two at Bruffels, being ferre by the Duke of Lorrain, to concert matters with our Governor General the Duke de Villa Hermofa, and with the Prince of Orange. The faid Duke of Lorrain was encamped the 2d instant near Mont St Jean, expecting the coming down of the rest of the Imperial Army, before he could be in a condition to engage in any action against the Enemy, who are taid to be 20000 strong in Lorrain, and are posted in distinct Bo ies on the Moscile, the Saar, and the Meufe. We no not yet hear that the Ofnabrug Munfte, or Luneiburg Troops, which are to come to the Millance of the Country, are on their march, which will be the cause that the Duke de Fitla Hermofa will not be able to begin the Campagne fo foon as were to be withed. The Totl Fillar t the French Troops are appoin ed to Renaczvous again, a is sa d, near Audenard; the King continues in hefe pares and will be at the faid Rendezv us; which makes f me believe that the Enemy will do something more yet in these parts thi Suma e sthan flan upon the cef nfive part.

It is May My parting from Clais the 30 pats, came the lame day about noon to St Other, where he continued till the second inflant, and then parted from thence to Bribane, where he lodged that night, and the next day continued his journy to Lill, where his Majosty purposed to remain some days To morrow the Mareichal de Sciomberg and the Duke of Luxent-Durgreturn from hence towards Flanders, where our Forces are to Rendervous the fifteenth of this inftant. We have Letters from Forenay, which affure us, that the King had detached 8000 men, who marched towards the Menfe, under the com-mand of the Sieur de la Cordoniere, lo whom the King Bas gr. vehi the command of Mailire de Camp General of the Light Hote, which the Marquis de Resnel had, who was killed be-fore Cambrer. From Merz of the 3d instant they write, that they had a repost there, that 10 or 12000 Imperialists were ad-vanced as far as Virdun, in which are 5000 French, and that the Duke of Lorrain had put an Imperial Garison into Luxembarg, the Spatist Troops that were there being fent to Namar.
