

Officers who are abroad to recruit their Companies, must have them compleat, or else they forfeit their Commands. The Marquis de Granville is expected in a day or two at *Brussels*, being sent by the Duke of Lorraine, to concert matters with our Governor General the Duke de Viller Hermosa, and with the Prince of Orange. The said Duke of Lorraine was encamped the 2d instant near *Mont St Jean*, expecting the coming down of the rest of the Imperial Army, before he could be in a condition to engage in any action against the Enemy, who are said to be 20000 strong in Lorraine, and are posted in distinct Bodies on the *Moselle*, the *Saar*, and the *Meuse*. We do not yet hear that the *Osnaburg* *Münster*, or *Lüneburg* Troops, which are to come to the assistance of these Countries, are on their march, which will be the cause that the Duke de Viller Hermosa will not be able to begin the Campaigne so soon as were to be wished. The 15th instant the French Troops are appointed to Rendezvous again, at 11 a clock, near *Audenard*; the King continues in these parts and will be at the said Rendezvous, which makes me believe that the Enemy will do something more yet in these parts this Summer, than has upon the defensive part.

Paris, May 8. His Majesty parting from *Châlons* the 30<sup>th</sup> past, came the same day about noon to *St Omer*, where he continued till the second instant, and then parted from thence to *Brisbane*, where he lodged that night, and the next day continued his journey to *Lill*, where his Majesty purposed to remain some days. Tomorrow the *Maréchal de Salomberg* and the Duke of *Luxemburg* return from hence towards *Flanders*, where our Forces are to Rendezvous the fifteenth of this instant. We have Letters from *Tonnay*, which assure us, that the King had detached 8000 men, who marched towards the *Meuse*, under the command of the *Sieur de la Cordoniere*, to whom the King has given the command of *Maître de Camp* General of the Light Horse, which the *Marquis de Resnel* had, who was killed before *Cambray*. From *Metz* of the 2d instant they write, that they had a report there, that 10 or 12000 Imperialists were advanced as far as *Virdun*, in which are 5000 French, and that the Duke of Lorraine had put an Imperial Garrison into *Luxemburg*, the Spanish Troops that were there being sent to *Namur*.
